World Trade Situation Deteriorated In 1949

LAKE SUCCESS, N. Y., Feb. 16—(CP)—United Nations economists reported tonight that the world trade situation became worse in 1949 and that all efforts to make it balance failed.

They suggested a complete re-evaluation of world economic policies and programs. This presumably would include the European recovery program.

The suggestion was submitted to the 18-member Economic and Social Council in an 101-page survey of major economic changes in 1949. The survey was prepared by experts in the U. N. secretariat.

The experts said that to bring improvement in world trade, the United States would have to continue large-scale aid, such as E. R. P., increase imports or decrease exports.

In Canada, the experts found the pressure of inflation had subsided, with some increase in real wages. But Canada also experienced some difficulty in finding outside markets for some surplus commodities including wood products. She could expect the same for wheat.

The report said the effect of devaluation on Britain's dollar problem is uncertain. But some improvement had been brought by restriction of imports from dollar areas.

The basic problem outlined was disruption of the old pattern of three-corner trade. European countries formerly paid for their imports from the United States by selling commodities to underdeveloped countries for dollars. The underdeveloped countries now are short of dollars because their exports to the United States have been reduced, through war devastation, development of synthetic substitutes in the United States, and increased consumption in their own products.

Besides some underdeveloped countries now are manufacturing commodities themselves which they formerly imported.

The economists suggested that Western Europe should adjust its production and trade to fit the needs of underdeveloped countries during the period of development.

As in previous surveys, there was little concrete information about economic conditions in Russia or her satellites. Russia reported that its industrial output in 1949 was 20 per cent higher than in 1948, but no specific production figures were given.

The report also noted total world industrial production in 1949 was nearly 40 per cent more than in 1947 and increased three per cent in 1949 over 1948.
