**Most Prolific Holstein Bull Is Dead**

Montvic Rag Apple Sovereign, noted Holstein bull owned by T. W. Dent and Clark E. Brown, Woodstock, Ontario died December 24. He is the most prolific sire ever used in Canada having a total of 1235 progeny registered to date with 160 cows still in calf to him. "Sovereign" was only seven years old, having been born April 17, 1942, in the herd of T. B. Macaulay, Hudson Heights, Quebec.

The \$4,075 paid by Dent and Brown for "Sovereign" as a baby calf was considered a large sum in 1942 but has been dwarfed by the earnings of this bull, most of his services outside the Dent and Brown herds having brought \$90 each. Individual progeny of "Sovereign" have sold for \$20.00; \$3,000 \$10,000; \$8,000; \$3,000; \$5,500. In addition, a daughter brought \$11,000, the highest price ever paid for a heifer calf in Canada. He, himself, was twice named All-Canadian and four times combined with his famous brother Montvic Rag Apple Marksman to win the All-Canadian Progeny of Dam award. Offspring of "Sovereign" have won many showing awards, these included seven All-Canadian and nine Reserve All-Canadian winnings. His son, Spring Farm Sovereign Supreme, was Grand Champion at the recent Royal Winter Fair and has been sold by J. M. Fraser, Streetsville, to Columbia, South America, for \$20,000.

**GERMAN STEEL OUTPUT**

DUESSELDORF, Germany, Jan. 3—(AP)—West Germany boosted its steel production about 50 per cent last year, but still fell short of its goal, the German Steel and Iron Office announced today. The total steel production in 1949 was 9,026,000 tons, compared with 5,920,000 tons in 1948. But the 1949 target was 9,600,000 tons.
