Pink Mayonnaise Gets Its Recipe From Love Appto

Pinkish in color, bland and smooth in consistency, and keenly interesting in flavor, tomato mayonnaise salad dressing will provide a pleasant change from plain mayonnaise.

2 egg yolks or 1 egg
2 cups salad oil
2 teaspoons dry mustard
1 teaspoon salt
1 tablespoon fruit sugar (optional)
1/4 cup (mixed) white vinegar and lemon juice

Creamed Celery

3 cups celery, cut in 1-inch pieces
3 tablespoons butter
3 tablespoons flour
2-3 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon pepper
1/2 cup rich or evaporated milk
1/2 cup celery stock

Apple Gingerbread

4 large apples
1 cup brown sugar
1 tablespoon lemon juice
1/4 cup butter or shortening
1/2 cup brown sugar
1/4 cup molasses
1 egg
2 cups sifted cake or pastry flour
or 1 1/2 cups sifted hard-wheat flour
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 1/2 teaspoons baking soda
1 1/2 teaspoons ground ginger
1 teaspoon cinnamon
1 cup sour milk

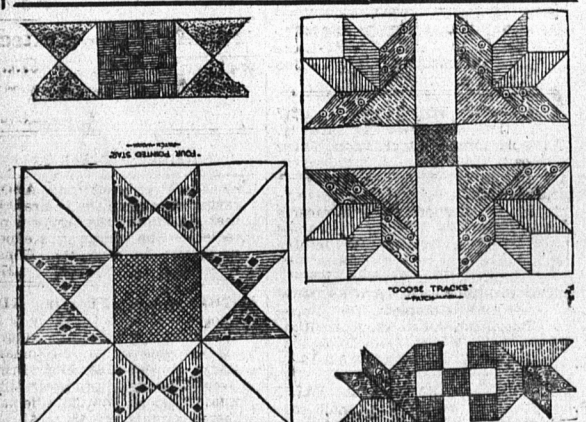

Use of Quilt Pattern
