ASPHALT PLANT PURCHASED - An asphalt plant has been purchased by the City from the Island Construction Company and is expected to be set up early this fall, when a suitable location for the plant is decided upon. Life At Camp With Ch'town Sea Cadet Corps
Wakey, Wakey, at Camp Brook was at 0700 and from then until "Pipe Down" at 2150 the Sea Cadets had a busy and happy day. The meals were of the best, a typical breakfast being grapefruit, cereal, bacon or eggs or both, bread, butter and milk. The breakfast efforts were clearly shown by the fact that 95 per cent of the Cadets gained weight, some as much as nine pounds in the two-week training period.

The training syllabus was so arranged that out of the four periods of instruction, two were spent on the water. Periods of seamanship and field training occupied the remainder of the instruction time. During the two or three wet days Padres Quinn and Ploughman gave lectures on "Good Seamanship" and "Naval Traditions. These were not the least important parts of the training.

The minor cuts and bruises and other ailments which are part and parcel of any summer camp were ably administered to by Miss Henderson, former R.C.N. Nursing Sister. Incidentally, it was noticed that the boys were not against visiting Sick Bay.

Captain Connolly and Lieut. Commander Kenny, chairman of the Sea Cadet Committee and C.O. of the Corps, respectively, were visitors to the Camp on the 12th and 13th. Their welcome perhaps was enhanced by the fact that they bore red plums and chocolate bars and field training occupied the remainder of the instruction time. On Friday, the 18th, the Director of Sea Cadets for Canada, Captain Musgrave (R.C.N.) and the Area Commanding Officer, Commander Bonnycastle, visited and inspected the Cadets and Camp. Captain Musgrave's remark that "it was the cleanest camp in Canada" spoke volumes for the young sailors.

Sea Cadet To Visit England
C.P.O. Lawson Drake, 106 Prince Street, Charlottetown, P.E.I. - a member of the Navy League Sea Cadet Corps "Kent" - is one of the Navy League sea cadets chosen to represent the Canadian sea cadet movement on a visit to the United Kingdom. Under the command of Lieut. Commander James M. Moffat, R.C.S.C., Weston, Ont., the party is scheduled to leave Halifax aboard H.M.C.S. "Warrior" on August 2nd, and on arrival in England, will be the guests of the Navy League of England and the British Admiralty.
Navy League officials say that young Drake has brought honor and distinction to himself, his corps and Charlottetown, by being so well qualified in all respects that he was chosen from among the thousands of sea cadets throughout Canada. In all there will be ten lads from Ontario, two each from British Columbia, Manitoba and Quebec; and one each from the other nine divisions of the Navy League hence the group will be thoroughly representative of the Canadian sea cadet corps from coast to coast.
According to present plans the sea cadets will spend a week in Royal Navy establishments, another week sightseeing and a third week on the Clyde among Royal Navy ships. In time permits, those having relatives will be given an opportunity to visit them. The party is expected to return to Canada about the end of August.

Crop Report
WINNIPEG, Man., July 28 - Hot dry weather has been general over the Prairie during the past week and as a result conditions in west central and northern Saskatchewan have further deteriorated. A good general rain would be beneficial over the whole prairie area but the crops are standing up well in Manitoba and in Northern Alberta and the Peace River territory. Nearly all the grain is headed out on the prairies but need additional moisture to fill properly. Some districts in southern Manitoba expect to start harvesting in ten days to two weeks. Reports of grasshopper hordes that on Saturday, the 18th, forty young Charlottetownians bid adieu to Camp Brook for at least this year.
