ALL ALIENS IN BRITAIN WILL BE INTERNED OR SENT HOME

Precautionary Methods Adopted by British Government for Safety of Resident Enemies and of the Country. Aliens Over Military Age will be Repatriated. As a Result of this Action Rioting has Largely Ceased.

(Special to The Guardian) LONDON, May 13.—Premier Asquith announced in the Commons today that all male enemies over military age will be repatriated. He also said that women and children in suitable cases will be repatriated though some might remain.

GENERAL LOUIS BOTHA MAY EXACT REPRISALS
