GREAT SIMILARITY.  
LONDON, Feb. 23.—The St. James Gazette  
says it sees in the senate proposals re-  
lative to Cuba a great similarity with Great  
Britain's suzerainty over the Transvaal.  
under the convention of 1894, and wonders

to any future ill-treatment of American  
citizens, similar to Mr. Kruger's maltreat-

between the United States and Cuba to

BRITISH DESERTERS.  
LONDON, February 23.—In consequence  
of reports received in England from Ceylon  
several non-commissioned officers belong-  
ing to one of the British regiments in  
Natal, before the war, have been sent out  
to Ceylon, to try to identify quite a num-  
ber of men who are among the Boer  
prisoners, and are believed to be deserters  
from that particular regiment.
