

**RELIGIOUS NOTES.**

It has been stated from certain reliable sources that the U.S. government was giving support, through General Otis, to the Roman Catholic church in the Philippines, and that even the general himself had suppressed the circulation of Bibles. The Independent states positively that all this is untrue, that in fact General Otis is a strict Presbyterian and has helped in distributing a large amount of Christian literature in the Island.

One often hears the statement these days that revivals are becoming fewer every year, and some draw the inference that love of religion is growing less. But it is to be noted that in spite of the dearth of revivals the numbers of members of the Christian churches is increasing at a ratio, faster than that of the population. The real significance of this is that a healthier religious condition is beginning to prevail.

The Japan Mail warns the Japanese government that it seems to be embarking on a course of religious intolerance which will injure her greatly, not only in her national morality, but also in her international reputation.

Rev. J. Hirst Hollowell of Rochdale, England, claimed in a public meeting that the war in the Transvaal was the "assassination of a brave people," and Rev. Herbert Arnold replied that it was a case of a free republic committing suicide. Feeling ran high for a time.

Rev. Dr. Stewart, moderator of the Free Church of Scotland, and for thirty years a missionary in South Africa, says that the issue in the Transvaal is not merely a question of franchise, monopolies or even oppression, but of the very principles on which a government should be carried on, and affecting the liberties of both blacks and whites.

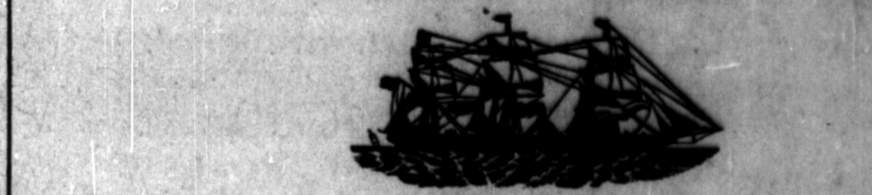
