A TROPICAL WONDERLAND

ITS ROMANCE AND ITS RACES

Demerara is the smallest county in extent but the largest in importance. Size isn't everything, though some six footers think it is. Demerara is the centre, the heart of the country. Into it and out of it flows the life of wonderland. Georgetown is its epitome. Imagine a city built on a raft of hard mud six feet below sea level. There it stands, a Garden City, a city of flowers and trees, and a beauty all its own.

The English in their matter of the prosaic style have named this city Georgetown after a stodgy king of Germana paternity, whose great grandfather found himself on the British. It should be named "El Dorado" or the "City of Palms" or "City of Babel" or a name of the kind. There are any number of places called Georgetown, but there is only one city of El Dorado, though just now the sugar planters don't think so for the bottom is not the sugar market. But we are not the sugar market. We are the plowers and wanderers in the wilderness. El Dorado has some sixty thousand people living in the homes nesting among the palm trees. It has forty five miles of streets, a fearful and wonderful street car service. It has a telephone service, although there is a quicker way of communication. It is Georgetown and that is, "El Dorado" or the "City of Palms" or "City of Babel" or a name of the kind. 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
