St. John has been making its jail prisoners work, and being insufficiently guarded some of their number the other day made their escape. They were recaptured, however.

Emigration from the British Isles seems to be increasing in volume. The returns for June show that 50 per cent more left British ports this year than in the like month of last year. Of the total emigration from the British Isles during the year ended with 30th June Canada secured 26 per cent. British emigration to the United States during the year decreased one third as compared with the previous year. All of which goes to show that the attractions of Canada as a home for settlers are becoming more and more apparent to the people of the Mother Country.

It appears that there is yet some uncertainty in regard to the Grand Trunk Pacific scheme. We noted the other day that the Liberal caucus, which it was supposed was called principally to consider this matter, failed to take it up. Reports from opposition sources tell that one trouble lies in the Government proposal to build the new line from Quebec to Moncton instead of utilizing the Intercolonial. It is objected that this will destroy the usefulness of the existing road which has cost so much money.

We commend to the esteemed Halifax Chronicle, which recently has championed public exhibitions of the so-called "manly art of self-defence," what its big Liberal brother the Toronto Globe has to say on the subject. The Globe thinks it a disgrace and an insult that so-called sports which are not tolerated in the state of New York or anywhere in the Republic outside of Nevada, should be permitted to thrive in Canada. There are many of the same way of thinking. It adds, "there is strong and urgent need for revision of the Criminal Code so that not only the utterly brutal exhibition recently given at Halifax and similar exhibitions occasionally given in Toronto may be declared illegal but also that Ontario may be freed from the disgrace of providing protection to thousands of Buffalo sports, whose presence on Canadian soil is an insult to the self-respect as well as the morality of our people."

President Loubet is visiting Great Britain, returning His Majesty's recent visit to the French capital. He is receiving a gracious and royal welcome. The two nations are now drawing closer together and the fact is largely due to their able and wise rulers, both of whom are lovers of peace. King Edward has already become a powerful personal influence for peace among the nations, and President Loubet is one of the ablest and most popular of the line of French republican rulers. He has steadfastly sought to influence his country men for peace, and with the most gratifying results.

The Pope still lives at this writing, notwithstanding the assault of his prostrating illness upon an always feeble frame, which has now stood the wear and tear of life for ninety-three years. His tenacity of life is wonderful. And his demise when it comes will still fall as a shock upon Christendom. One half the Christian world regards the dying Pontiff with a wonderful love and reverence. The other half has also been inspired with respect for his many worthy, gracious and winning qualities of mind and heart. In no past age, and toward no previous Pope was the feeling of the Protestant world so kindly and respectful.
