It may be worth while to recall some features of Russian aggressions in the east during the past few years. It was in 1896, after the outbreak in Korea, and in the plea of some anti-Christian atrocities that Russia practically coerced China to grant a concession for the railway across Manchuria to connect Port Arthur with the Trans-Siberian Railway.

In the following year, in consequence of the murder of two German missionaries, Germany landed an armed force at Kiao Chou, took possession and further exacted the title of Samsah as a coaling station. In the spring of 1898 Britain undertook to guarantee a loan of \$30,000,000 to China toward paying the Japanese war indemnity and China agreed to open her inland waters to foreign navigation, and maintain an Englishman at the head of her maritime customs.

Russia therefore in 1898 demanded the cession of Port Arthur and Tallienwan. In the event of non-compliance [the Russian occupation of Manchuria was threatened. China gave in and the Russian flag was hoisted over Port Arthur and Tallienwan and Russian tariff restrictions put in force. Then China was squeezed into ceding to Russia the island known as Deer Island, commanding the entrance to Fusan, in Korea. Britain then claimed compensation and secured a lease of Wei Hai Wei for ninety nine years, and a lease for the same term of 200 square miles on the mainland opposite Hong Kong. These concessions to the powers cost Li Hung Chang his official position and he was dismissed in disgrace.

Russia had engaged to evacuate Manchuria, but on various pretexts prolonged her stay and strengthened her position. At one time the pretext was an assault by some Chinese bandits upon a Russian citizen or soldier, at another time to keep

her railway secure. In 1899 came the Boxer rising, the murder of missionaries and the attack upon the European and American legations in Peking. Russia again made this the pretext to prolong her occupation of Manchuria and strengthen her position there.

All this time the promise of Russia to evacuate Manchuria was still outstanding. That it was never intended to be kept is now more than apparent. Fortifications and permanent barracks for an increasing number of troops have been erected. Finally under pressure from Japan and other powers the 8th of October last was fixed by Russia as the date for the evacuation. Not only was the obligation violated but Russian diplomacy has declined to offer any excuse or pretext further than that Russia's interests necessitate the longer continuance of the occupation.
