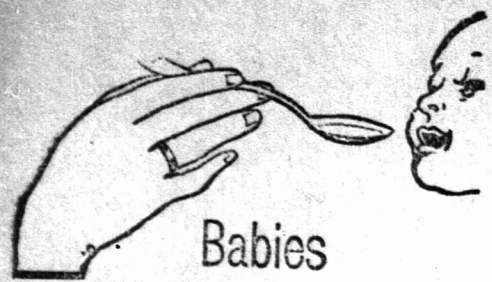


London Bank Clearings.

EDITORIAL NOTES.

It is now announced that after one week's trial under the editorial direction of Rev. Mr. Sheldon, the proprietors of the Topeka Capital will permanently adopt his methods and continue the paper as a strictly Christian daily newspaper.

Paul Kruger is a famous annexationist. Early in the war he proclaimed the annexation of Northern Natal, a large part of Cape Colony and Bachuanaland and more recently of the Orange Free State. The British territories are still British. Lord Roberts holds the Free State capital and is on his way to the capital of the Transvaal. Already Kruger has been outplayed in the annexation game and by the time his next birthday comes round six months hence Oom Paul will be able to fence in his territories with the leather of his boots.

Says the Boston Herald—

The Boers have no longer any chance of resisting the British empire in arms. They are beaten beyond retrieval, and they ought to be good enough soldiers to recognize their desperate military condition. Outnumbered three, or perhaps four, to one, outgeneralled, for Lord Roberts has shown himself an easy master of his Boer opponents in strategy, discomfited in all their recent movements and driven from every position which they have attempted to hold, the burghers are on the down grade, and every day brings them to a lower level. It seems a pity, may it be a world's pity, that they do not recognize the situation and endeavor in a frank and sensible manner to come to terms with Great Britain, even if the leak they will have to eat may be very bitter in the mouth.

It appears that the British Columbia Contingent of sixty men recruited for garrison duty at Halifax have been detained to supplement the imperial garrison of Artillery and Engineers now at Esquimalt. The fact has caused some comment in military circles. The only explanation offered is that some rumors of Fenian machinations against these fortifications at Esquimalt, which are the most important on the Pacific Coast, have caused the guards to be doubled for some weeks past, and the present small force was so severely taxed in fulfilling guard duties that construction work has been considerably impeded.

The second Canadian Contingent, commonly spoken of as the Mounted Rifles, were recently reported at Carnarvon, Cape Colony. Carnarvon is a town of about 1,000 people located some 150 miles south-west of Kimberly. It is the centre of a sheep raising district and here is located a vast reservoir, the largest in the colony, utilised for purposes of water supply and irrigation. The Dutch population thereabout had risen against British authority and the Canadians and a small force of Yeomanry were sent thither to bring them into subjection, which appears to have been effected without serious fighting. The presence of Lord Kitchener in the vicinity shows the importance of the work.

The Duke of Orleans, head of the Royalist party in France, has recently made an indecent exposure of his inner nature. He wrote the French caricaturist, who made degrading and libellous pictures of the Queen and congratulated him on the success of his work. The artist—save the mark—made public the letter and thereupon the Duke publicly denied having written it. Then a fac simile of his letter was published and he was forced to admit having written it, but tried to crawl out under the excuse that he had not intended it should be made public! Thus the Duke, who had obtained a refuge in England when driven out of France, and who had received much kindness at the hands of Queen Victoria and the British people, is revealed in his true character as an ingrate, a liar and a contemptible cad.

A French Canadian hunter and trapper, Joseph Zotique La Joie by name has com-

municated to the New York Herald the Manhausen story that a few years ago he discovered and walked around the North Pole. He describes it as a small, luminous mountain about 300 feet high, built like a big bee hive, and shedding light for hundreds of miles around. From all sides of the polar hill flowed a hot liquid resembling syrup, which fell into a basin from which it was drawn off by subterranean channels. He learned that it was the pole because, as he walked around it his compass always pointed inwards. The region around the pole, he says is inhabited by a superior race of men, whose language he learned, and who built him a boat of whaleskin in which after incredible hardships he returned to civilization.

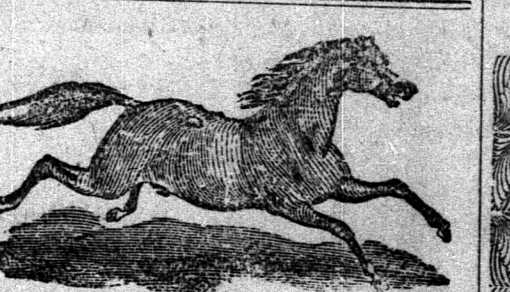
