CANADA'S CONTINGENT

21,000 Men, Infantry and Artillery to be Raised.

OTTAWA, Aug. 5.—A few special officers are being obtained from the British Admiralty. With the rain-boat which is now in commission with the two submarines purchased from Chile will form valuable defence against possible raids from German vessels which may be detached from the German squadron now on the Pacific. On the Atlantic coast a call for naval reservists to man the Niobe has met with prompt response and the cruiser will be in commission in a few days. Parliament will be asked to pass a vote for the two submarines purchased from Chile as soon as it meets. The cost of armament has not yet been given out. A special issue of the Canada Gazette published today contains notice that the Niobe and Rainbow have been placed at the disposal of His Majesty's Imperial Government. There is also a formal proclamation announcing a message from Britain stating that war has been declared against Germany. Orders were issued this afternoon for the enlistment and mobilization at Quebec of a Canadian army division numbering approximately 21,000 men of whom 13,000 will be infantry, the rest artillery, engineering corps, signalling corps and other branches of the militia connected with the active service. The enlistment which will start at various military centres throughout Canada will be in charge of the District Officer Commanding. It has been decided not to call the men out by regiment. Enlistment will take at least a week or so and the force is not likely to be mobilized in Quebec much before the meeting of Parliament a week from next Tuesday. What will be the disposition of the forces has not been determined pending the action of Parliament and word from the war office as to whether or not Canada's troops will be needed for service outside of Canada. The force will be imperial and will have the same status as British regulars inasmuch as the offers received from volunteers already are two or three times the number actually required at the present time by the militia department. The Minister of Militia is arranging to have only the best men chosen from each station from the point of physical and general military qualifications. Every man will have to submit to rigorous medical examination. Ability to shoot straight will also be a determining factor. Other considerations being equal, officers and men will be selected in the following order: Unmarried men, married men without families, married men with families, except in special cases ages limit will be 18 to 45 years.

OTTAWA, Aug. 5.—One of the war duties which Canada will probably have to assume is that of taking care of Great Britain's prisoners of war. There will undoubtedly be thousands of these, as Great Britain is not anxious to keep them there, where food supplies will be more or less limited and where the nearness to the continent would lead to numerous attempts to escape. At the time of the Boer war prisoners were sent to Bermuda.

In the present case Canada could render valuable assistance by relieving Great Britain of the cost and worry of looking after these prisoners. They will probably be sent to Western Canada, where local militia forces can easily guard an escape-

ment and where there would be little use of them attempting to escape, since communication with Germany or Austria, even via the United States, will be practically cut off until the termination of the war.

Moreover it would not be a bad stroke of business for the Government, since after the war, considerable number of these prisoners might become permanent immigrants to Canada and take up homesteads in the West.

QUEBEC MOBILIZING

QUEBEC, Aug. 6.—The 9th Regt. of Infantry received orders from Ottawa to mobilize at once, and hold themselves in readiness for anything.

ASKS ALL PAPERS TO WITHHOLD MOVEMENTS

OTTAWA, Aug. 6.—Colonel Sam. Hughes has addressed the following open letter to the press of Canada concerning the publication of news in war time:

"In the grave circumstances with which the Dominion as a part of the British Empire is faced to-day, I venture to appeal to patriotic Canadian newspapers, their proprietors, and their staffs alike, to exercise wise reticence upon matters affecting military operations.

"Enormous assistance can be given to a belligerent by the newspapers of its opponents, if those newspapers are unguarded; and conversely great advantages can be gained by the armed forces of a nation if its press exercises a patriotic restraint.

"I earnestly entreat you to abstain from publishing unauthorized statements, as to military happenings in Canada, such as the assembling or moving of regiments, the purchase of remounts stores or supplies, the erection of fortifications, etc. We may be certain that the agents of hostile Powers are searching your pages eagerly for statements as to the movements of our military forces, the nature and disposition of our defenses and other facts bearing upon the prosecution of war. Such information as to steps to be taken by Canada will be supplied by the Government department concerned, which will bear in mind the restraint to which those will be subjected."

LAURIER'S CRIME IS NOW APPARENT

People of Canada Now Recognize Reality of Emergency in Naval Policy

OTTAWA, August 6.—Hon. Robert Rogers, who returned to the Capital today, was much interested in the war. He expressed himself freely on the justification of the Government's naval policy and on the disastrous result of the Liberal opposition. Said Hon. Mr. Rogers:

"I do not suppose Sir Wilfrid Laurier is as yet convinced there is an emergency. Whether he is or not, let me tell you the people of Canada are convinced and realize to the full extent the great crime committed by Sir Wilfrid in having his majority in the Senate defeat our naval bill. How different would Canada's position appear today had the will of the Canadian people, as expressed through their representatives in the House of Commons, been given effect. However, this is not the time to deal with the past; we must at this moment deal with our present conditions, and the Government can be depended upon to do it in a manner that will inspire the confidence of every Canadian."

AUSTRALIA'S OFFER

Force of 20,000 Men And All Her Warships

SYDNEY, N.S.W., August 6.—The Commonwealth has decided to offer the Imperial Government an expeditionary force of 20,000 men and to place the Australian warships under the control of the Admiralty.

A censorship has been established in Australia and the Fiji Islands. The movements of the Australian warships are unknown.

The New Zealand, defense department has taken over the control of the chief harbors. German steamers continue to hurriedly leave Australian ports. It is surmised that they are seeking refuge in German Pacific ports. German and French reservists in Australia have been called to their respective colors.

LONDON, Aug. 6.—England officially announced today that she has accepted the Australian offer to furnish her navy and pay for maintenance.

THE MAURETANIA'S RACE

To Avoid Sneaking German Cruisers.

(Canadian Press.) HALIFAX, August 6.—To escape capture of marauding cruisers, two of the largest and finest passenger steamers afloat, the Cunard Liner Mauretania and White Star Liner Cedric escorted by H.M.S. Essex, reached Halifax Harbor this morning.

The Liner Mauretania was the first to report herself, she having a passenger list totalling 1,400. The

Cedric reported nearly as many.

HALIFAX, Aug. 6.—The biggest steamship that ever pushed her huge bulk into Halifax harbor raced in today to escape capture by German cruisers. She was the Mauretania, the leviathan Cunard liner, bound from Liverpool to New York.

"There are three German cruisers sneaking around the coast between Halifax and New York." "Flee to Halifax," was the gist of a wireless message flashed by H. M. S. Essex to Mauretania last night.
