AUGSBURG, Bavaria, Oct 3.—The national temperance convention in session here, gave one day to honoring Judge William Jefferson Pollock of St Louis, whose system of reforming inebriates will be introduced into Germany. Last year the international anti-alcoholic congress declaration in favor of the enforcement of the Pollard system, which places drinkards on probation on their taking the pledge.
