In the report of the Labor Union meeting in these columns yesterday morning the name of President Geo. Gallant was omitted. The following are the Alberton market prices: White oats per bus, 41 cents; black oats per bus, 42 cents; butter per lb, 16 cents; eggs per doz, 16 cents; pork per lb, 10 cents; hides per lb, 8 cents; loose hay per ton \$9, and pressed per ton \$9 to \$10.

Dealers in Summerside yesterday were paying 18 to 20 cents a lb for butter; 42 to 43 cents a bus for oats; 11 cents a lb for pork; 9 cents a lb for hides; \$10 to \$10.50 a ton for hay and 12 to 13 cents a lb for chickens.

The ice on Summerside harbor has nearly all broken up and what is left of it floats in and out with the tide, only being kept in the harbor by the narrow bridge at the entrance which is left a half a mile wide and which should be of no trouble for the Empress to break through.

STOCK MARKET IS DULL AND SAGGING

NEW YORK, March 30—The course of the price movement of stocks shifted again today. The amounts offered for sale were not of great volume, but the demand was insufficient to absorb them except at material concessions. The dealings had an appearance of professionalism and the market was obviously narrow and apathetic. There was no striking news developments to explain the action of the market. The professional element had no difficulty in discerning that demand had practically disappeared at the higher levels brought about by the rally of yesterday afternoon and this morning. The turn to the selling side was the logical conclusion. The opinion is heard with growing frequency in banking quarters that an era of short term note issues is again approaching, such as heralded the over-supply of capital issues through years ago. Special interest for that reason attaches to the opinion of Chairman James J. Hill, of the Great Northern, regarding him as expert authority, that the railroads of the country will require new capital at the rate of \$1,600,000,000 a year for six years to come to provide for absolute necessities. In face of this necessity, the demand for bonds from home and foreign domestic investment sources continues to fall off. Foreign exchange rates moved up again, rates for next week's steamers carrying a premium over those for this week. It was not known that actual arrangements were made to ship gold, but international bankers expect a movement to develop with the turn of the month. The growing tempo of the demand for money has an ominous influence on sentiment as it is attributed, in part, to a falling off from mercantile and manufacturing borrowers. The bond market was apathetic and irregular, due to slight recoveries of some recent sharp declines. Total sales, par value, \$3,106,000. United States bonds were unchanged on call.

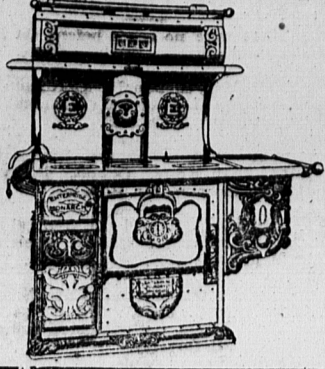
