Canadian Exploration.

Messrs. Dr. N. Collie and A. I. Mumm, of London, have returned to Edmonton after two months spent in the Canadian Rockies on the line of the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway. These gentlemen have been exploring a hitherto unknown region in the vicinity of Mount Robson, the highest peak in the Canadian Rockies, and were accompanied by a train of 20 pack horses. They state that in some places the forests were so impenetrable that they had to cut their way through. In one locality they came across two great glaciers, larger than any known in the Rockies, and sighted a lowering peak that had the appearance of being even larger than Mount Robson, which is 13,700 feet above the level of the sea. One of the glaciers was 40 to 50 miles in length, and several to eight miles in width, and of striking formation.

LEGISLATIVE BELLS.

There Are 739 of Them in the Capitol at Washington.

Whenever there is a roll call in the house of representatives or any other procedure requiring the attendance of members 600 electric bells start ringing simultaneously. They are operated from a switchboard or call box at the speaker's desk. Similarly in the senate 239 bells are operated. At the capitol these bells are known as legislative bells.

Four hundred of the house bells are in the house office building and 100 in the house wing of the capitol. There is a bell in the room of every member, one in every committee room and several in the cloakrooms, corridors, lobbies and restaurants. In the senate office building there are 140 gongs and ninety-nine in the senate proper.

On the roll call in either house the signal is given as soon as the first name is called by the clerk. Senators and congressmen who are in their offices hurry to their respective chambers in order to answer to their names. Each house has a different system of signals, as follows:

The senate—One bell, yeas and nays; two bells, call of the senate; three bells, executive session; four bells, adjournment; five bells, doors open after executive session.

Executive session. The senate—One bell, yeas and nays; two bells, yeas and nays; three bells, call of the house; four bells, adjournment; five bells, recess.—Brooklyn Eagle.

DECAYING SPLENDOR.

As Seen In the Ruins of the Imperial Tombs of Nanking.

Few of the splendors of Nanking, once the populous and prosperous capital of the Chinese empire, survive, for the city began to decline about the year 1276, when the Mongols moved to Peking. Some of the more durable of its public works and decorations remain in part and probably the best preserved is the avenue leading to the famous Ming Tombs. On either side of this thoroughfare are massive stone figures of rulers, camels and lions, as if guarding the road over which were borne to their final resting places the once mighty rulers of the world's most populous country. Each of the two figures in the foreground was carved from one piece of stone and is about 12 feet high. The stone sentries in the distance, proportionately large, were produced in the same manner and give an impressive lesson of the patient and persevering industry of the Chinese. These monuments to despotism are fully 500 years old. The avenue of the tombs upon which time have made telling ravages. It is believed that some, if not all, of the massive stone animal figures were used as sepulchres for faithful adherents of the occupants of the Imperial tombs. Thus in sepulchres of the same relative positions.

In the years when these stone figures were carved and the avenue constructed, Nanking had a population of 4,000,000 and rivaled any other city in the world in its palaces, libraries, institutions of learning, commerce and manufactures. Its porcelain tower, built in 1413-32 by Emperor Yungkow in commemoration of his mother, was one of the most wonderful structures of the centuries. It was octagonal in form 322 feet high, slightly tapering and with a spiral staircase within. The tower was provided with a gallery and a projecting roof from the corners of which bells were suspended. In the interior a spiral staircase led to the summit, formed by an elegant spire, on the top of which rested a ball of brass overlaid with silver. Each story was many of the other great works of the city disappeared during the period from 1853 to 1864, when the Tai-Pings were in possession of the city.

Amid the ruins of the Imperial palace, only the square tower, 50 feet high, is now standing, and on the top thereof is the gigantic statue of a turtle.

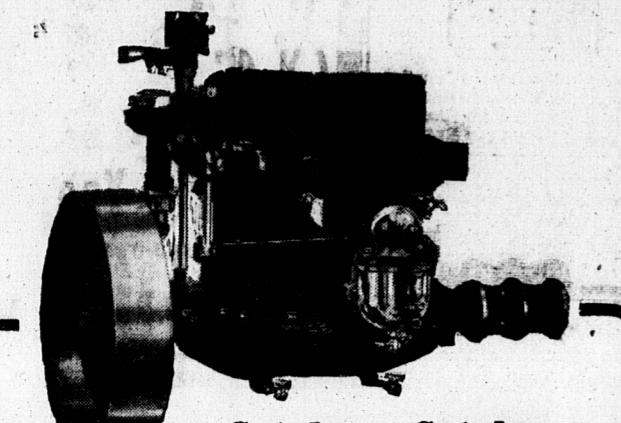
