Farm Laborers For The West

Canadian National Railways Will Give Reduced Fares and Special Train Service on August 18th.

Harvesters are urgently needed in the West to garner in the wheat yield of Canada.

Estimates are that over 300,000 bushels of wheat stand ready for reaping.

The call of the West is for 30,000 Farm Laborers to harvest this immense grain crop.

The Canadian National Railways is prepared for the transport of harvesters from all parts of the System.

Special arrangements have been made. Reduced fares to Winnipeg are to be granted on August 13th.

Special trains will run via Quebec Bridge and from Quebec to Winnipeg via the Transcontinental Line.

The Transcontinental Line is the best and quickest route from Maritime Provinces points.

The trains will carry the best type of new colonist cars, and special arrangements will be made for the supply of bit lunches en route.

Special provision will be made for women accompanying the party or desiring to take advantage of the excursion rates.

The fare from Charlottetown to Winnipeg is \$24.85, plus half a cent per mile to points West of Winnipeg.

The return fare is half a cent per mile from all points West of Winnipeg to Charlottetown.

Verification certificates will be furnished by Ticket Agents when ticket is purchased enabling holder to secure return ticket at reduced fare.

WATER PUMP GIVES TROUBLE

A. E. M. Asks: Why is it that I cannot make my water pump tight? I have replaced it several times, but water still escapes slowly along the shaft?

Answer: You may possibly find that the shaft, where it passes through the stuffing box is worn considerably out of round. If so, it may have to be replaced as it is almost impossible to pack a shaft in a badly worn condition.

Some times it happens that, if the radiator is badly clogged, leakage at the stuffing box occurs, because of the extra pump pressure that acts upon it. Asbestos-graphite string packing is the best material to use and we presume that you have tried it.
