### TRYING TO AGREE

Laurier and Fairbanks Keep Wires Busy.

### THE HIGH COMMISSION.

Will not Meet in August as Expected But May Do So Next Autumn.

WASHINGTON, July 20.—The return from Alaska of Senator Fairbanks has brought to a decisive issue the future of the high joint commission body, not only as it relates to the Alaska boundary but the entire scope of its work. Following extended conference between Mr. Fairbanks and Secretary Day, as well as with the President, despatches have been exchanged between the British and Canadian authorities and those in Washington. Already it is assured practically beyond a doubt that the commission will not resume its sessions at that its reassembling will be in the late fall.

WASHINGTON, D. C. July 20.—Notwithstanding a rapid change of telegrams during the day between Senator Fairbanks, in this city, and Sir Wilfrid Laurier, in Ottawa, at the close of office hours no arrangement had been reached as to the postponement of the meeting of the joint high commission.

Some interest attached to this apparent transfer of the negotiations from Mr. Choate and Lord Salisbury in London, to Senator Fairbanks and Sir Wilfrid Laurier on this side, and perhaps it is this that has given rise to the hope of a re-assembling of the commission.

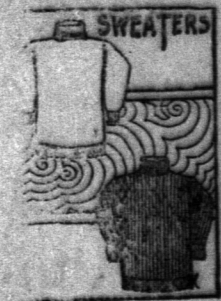
