VALUABLE HORSE COMING

A valuable horse will come to the Island this week from New York. The animal is Commodore Ledyard, a trotter foaled in June 1901 and the purchaser, Hon. R. C. McLeod Summerside. Commodore Ledyard is fifteen one hands high, bay, standard sired by Admiral Dewey, record 2,144 (3), dam Lady Ethlynn record 2,244 (3).

The sire of Admiral Dewey was the great race horse Blagen (2,061), the sire of seven in the list. The dam was the great Nancy Hawks (2,044). Blagen's sire was May King, sire of 13 in the list and he by Elcklonner. The sire of Nancy Hawks was Happy Medium, sire of 94 in the list. Her dam was Nancy Lee by Dictator.

The sire of Lady Ethlynn was Jackdaw, 2,283, by Jay Bird. The dam of Jackdaw was Biddy McGregor by Robert McGregor, the sire of Crescens 1,592. The dam of Lady Ethlynn was Queen McGregor by Fergus McGregor, sire of 23 in the list, dam Cora 2,25 by Corlander, dam of two in the list. Commodore Ledyard was bred by J. Malcolm Forbes and consigned to the Fasig-Tipton Sale at New York, and was there purchased by T. J. Cameron, son of Marshal Cameron of this city, for Hon. R. C. McLeod, Summerside.

This colt is entered in \$30,500 futurities. He is a handsome, stylish, fire gaited, lever headed colt that will surely make a trotter. This fine animal will be a great addition to the breeding stock of the Province.

Great credit is due to Mr Cameron in his selection of this well bred horse and also Mr. McLeod in his efforts to improve the Island stock.

Commodore Ledyard has never been handled much for speed on account of his age but has been sent halves in 1.12 and quarters in 35 seconds.

Commodore Ledyard will arrive in Summerside this week.
