IN MEMORIAM MR. DONALD H. McDONALD Mr. Donald H. McDonald of Bradalbane, died on 14th inst., aged 88, being the last of a family of nine who emigrated from Isle of Skye, Scotland, 1858, settled in Bradalbane then a dense forest but changed to a fertile and beautiful plateau.

MR. PAUL LEA RETIRES Mr. Paul Lea a prominent business man of Moncton, has retired from business, having disposed of all his holdings to B. W. Lockhart Co., Ltd. Mr. Lea was born on the 2nd day of May, A. D. 1854 at Tryon, P. E. I. He was the son of John D. Lea a farmer, who had emigrated from Lincolnshire, England, to P. E. Island. Mr. Lea remembers the Confederation conference at Charlottetown and attended its sessions in 1867. Mr. Lea left the island for Sacramento via New York by steamer to the Isthmus of Panama and then to California, reaching there with out a shilling. He found immediate work in a woodworking mill. After four years he returned to P. E. Island, where he opened a sash and door factory. In 1873 he married Miss Anna McEachern. He moved to Moncton in 1885, where he laid the foundation of the woodworking business from which he is retiring today. In 1892 Mr. Lea's plant was completely destroyed by fire and was a total loss as he carried no insurance. Nothing daunted, he started again. By perseverance and pluck, hard work, business ability and studious attention to business he succeeded in once more, placing his business on a firm footing and is able today to retire with the feeling that he has deserved a well earned rest and sufficient of the world's goods to spend his declining years in comfort and peace. Mr. Lea has always been prominent in the business and civic affairs of the city. He was twice alderman. He leaves a reputation for honesty, integrity, straightforwardness and business acumen which is a credit to himself and the city which was the scene of his activities. The citizens of Moncton generally join in congratulating him on the completion of an eminently successful business career. Mr. Lea's wife died last summer. His family consists of Mrs. Doud (Boston), John Lea of Summerside, P. E. Island, Marion Charles, Elinor at home and Mrs. (Dr) Steves, British Columbia. St. John Journal. Mr. Lea built the first sash and door factory on the island near the present site of Davis and Fraser's plant in Charlottetown.

FREDERICK McAVINN Aged 36 years, Frederick McAvinn, youngest son of the late Francis and Catherine McAvinn, died at South Dayton, New York, October 29. Before leaving St. John for Buffalo, about ten years ago, he was employed in Dick's drug store. He afterwards removed to South Dayton and served in the American Army in the late war. Besides his wife and two children, Adeline and Frederick, Jr., South Dayton, he is survived by one sister, Mrs. Florence of St. Mary's home in Moncton. His father, Frank McAvinn, was a member of the firm of McAvinn and Kicham, St. John, for many years. He was about 75 years of age when he died. He was buried in a private funeral home in South Dayton, where he lived with his brothers and sisters. His death took place about two months ago.
