### LIPTON TO RACE NEW YACHT.

Shamrock and Sybarita Will Have Contest in Spring Along Coast of the Riviera.

**LONDON, Sept. 10.**—Sir Thomas Lipton's Shamrock and Whittaker Wright's Sybarita will race in the Riviera in the spring, the course extending all around the coast. The Sybarita will race as a cutter.

The opinion of British yachtsmen is that British yacht hands are the best, but that the Herreshoffs can beat any British builder.

Practically all of the crew of Wright's boat will be on the new Shamrock. The old and the new Shamrock will race in American waters, and the trials are looked forward to by British yachtsmen as opening a new era in races for the cup.

English sentiment is against any extension of the time limit.

### CHINESE MINISTER PLEASSED.

**WASHINGTON, Sept. 12.**—The Chinese minister called at the state department this morning and received a favorable response to his application of yesterday for exemption from interference by the United States Government to Li Hung Chang on his journey from Shang Hai to Peking.
