Field Day At Monticello

Over 100 people attended the Field Day held on the farm of Hugh J. MacDonald, Monticello, on Friday afternoon, Aug. 12th under the direction of Mr. W.N. Black, supervisor of Illustration Stations for P.E.I. After welcoming those attending, Mr. Black introduced Mrs. Harry Cudmore, Director, First Aid, Swimming and Water Safety, C.R.C., Charlottetown, who addressed the women and gave a First Aid demonstration while the men were on a tour of the farm.

FIELD TOUR

Field experiments on roots, potatoes, hay and grain were observed. Considerable discussion, led by Mr. D.C. Schurman, Assistant to Superintendent in field crops, Experimental Farm, Charlottetown, took place concerning the growing of alfalfa on light soils. Mr. MacDonald has succeeded in establishing a fair stand of alfalfa in his hay fields. The group was then shown sixteen different varieties of oats that Mr. A.B. MacLaren, cerealist, Experimental Station, Charlottetown, has under test on Mr. MacDonald's farm.

After the field tour a judging class in Ayrshire cows was conducted by Mr. S.C. Wright, Field Promoter, Prov. Dept. of Agriculture, members of the Hopeful Farmers Calf Club and a number of farmers participated in the judging. The following were the winners of the event:

Mr. Black then introduced the Hon. W.F. Alan Stewart, Minister of Agriculture for P.E.I. Mr. Stewart in his very capable manner, entertained the group for a few moments with humorous anecdotes. Then more seriously, he remarked on the fact that he was continuously noticing that while barns were becoming more modern, the home kitchen was as old-fashioned as ever. The housewife was still putting up with outmoded facilities, especially for water.

Mr. Stewart then went on to say that young farm people did not realize the importance of their job. He urged them to take pride in their calling for the whole world depends upon the farmer for its very existence.

Reported to be the fast-moving story of international gangsters and money smuggling, "Johnny Allegro" casts Raft as a slick, quick-witted character, with a shady past, who is employed by the government to trap a mob flooding the U. S. with illegal currency. Miss Foch plays a glamour girl who falls for Raft, while Maccready, as her husband and head of the money mobsters, is probably the oddest villain of the year in the role of a cultivated scholar who delights in eliminating his opponents with a primitive bow and arrow.

"JULIA MISBEHAVES" RIB-TICKLING ROMANTIC COMEDY WITH 'NEW' GREEN GARSON

It's a Greer Garson you've never seen before in M-G-M's rib-tickling romantic comedy, "Julia Misbehaves," stellar attraction at the Prince Edward Theatre. Reunited with Walter Pidgeon, with whom she shared many of her previous triumphs, Miss Garson now goes on an all-out comedy spree as a woman determined to win back her estranged husband, Bill, and marriageable daughter, Susan, by any means—fair or foul.

It takes some completely daffy doings on the part of the ex-London music hall queen, Julia Packard, to convince Bill that he can't live without her—among them, a screamingly funny bubble bath sequence, an act in which Julia sings while swinging upside down on a high trapeze, a performing seal, an encounter with a plucking bear and an unexpected eruption into a freezing lake—but, aided by a soft-hearted pawnbroker, a skirt-chasing English lord and a riotous family of acrobats, she not only recaptures Bill but steers Susan smack into the arms of the young artist she loves.

Miss Garson is a pure delight as the conniving Julia, proving herself as much at home in light comedy as in her more familiar emotional roles, while Pidgeon, as usual, is admirably cast as her fencing partner—this time the duel being one chiefly of laughs. Elizabeth Taylor is the appealing young Susan, with Peter Lawford as the recklessly romantic artist with whom she elopes. Cesar Romero has a field day with the role of the "Flying Ghenocchio," an acrobat long on brawn but somewhat short on brain, and Mary Boland adds to the hilarity as the champagne-loving Ma Ghenocchio who can never keep out of trouble. Then there are Lucile Watson, representing the snobbish British uppercrust, Nigel Bruce as the philandering Col. Willowbrook, and Reginald Owen as the glibbie pawnbroker—all of them excellent.
