LOOKING AT ALL SIDES OF THE QUESTION.

The trade agreement is naturally looked to by the farmers and fisher- men of the Province from the stand- point of men who have something to sell. They have usually a large sur- plus of oats, potatoes, dairy pro- ducts, horses, lamb and fish and sometimes of hay to sell. There is not one of these articles that a sen- sible and intelligent farmer has any fear the Americans, or the favored nations will send to this Province for sale. Our farmers are not troubling themselves at all about competition in their immediate home market, and in this they are clearly right.

But the Island farmer is naturally interested in the fact that the large cash market of New England will be opened to him by the trade agree- ment. This may be said to be en- tirely a new market, because it has been so long closed to him by al- most prohibitive duties. It is a new, near, cash market in addition to the markets he has had heretofore. The immediate home market, the Newfoundland and the British mar- kets, will be in no way interfered with by reciprocity. The markets of the Canadian Mainland will be quite as open to our farmers as they are now, and they will have free access to the New England market in addi- tion.

In this view of the case there can be no possible harm or danger come to farmers or fishermen from the trade agreement. Now let us look at it for a moment in another light. Suppose that our farmers were now in the enjoyment of the New England market, with the higher prices which there prevail, and it was now proposed to close that market against us. Suppose further that it was proposed to vote among the farmers of Prince Edward Island whether to close the New England market or not— to restore the present duties after they had been taken off—is it reason- able to believe that one in ten of our farmers would vote to do so?

We do not think so. And yet it is a poor rule that will not work both ways. If it would be bad to close that market when open it must be good now to open it. Again, sup- pose that our farmers were now in the enjoyment of the New England market, with the higher prices which there prevail, and it was now proposed to close that market against us. Suppose further that it was proposed to vote among the farmers of Prince Edward Island whether to close the New England market or not— to restore the present duties after they had been taken off—is it reason- able to believe that one in ten of our farmers would vote to do so?

We have looked in vain through all the arguments of the anti-reciprocity speakers for any convincing evidence that the tariff on food-stuffs has ever been of any benefit to the Prince Edward Island farmer.

There has never yet been a time within our memory when our farmers had good crops, that they did not desire free admission for one or another of their products to the American market, if not for all. And under reciprocity, the home market and the British market will still be open to them for the sale of any products which they cannot sell to advantage in New England.
