DISHONEST TRADE TRANSACTIONS

Rev. R. P. Bowles Refers to the Responsibility of Directors, to Shareholders, and the Evils of the "Drawback," "Rake-Off" and "Graft."

TORONTO, March 21.—Some plain things were said in a general way in Sherbourne street Methodist church by the pastor, Rev. R. P. Bowles, whose theme, "Commercial Dishonesties," gave him opportunity to refer to investigations, insurance and otherwise.

which lead on to the greater crimes. It might be possible to become morbid and over-scrupulous regarding some petty trifles, such as a pin or a few matches or a postage stamp, but this must not make us indifferent to petty thieving.

"The growth of language is most significant," continued the preacher. "There we arriving among us a whole swarm of words and phrases denoting a dishonesty which is piled in semi-honest or questionable ways. Some we find in the dictionary; others are in the language of the street and journalism."

RAKE-OFF AND GRAFT.

"Dishonor enters often by indirect ways and not by direct petty thieving. Perhaps the most common is by the rake-off. This term defines a too common custom. It is profit to which one is not entitled, profit secretly added to one's remuneration, whether that be salary or commission. We find it in the case of the large buyer, the foreman, the small contractor who builds our houses, the architect. Everyone who takes a rake-off is guilty of double-dealing; he takes what does not belong to him."

"Graft differs little from the rake-off. It is used in general in relation to offices of trust, whether public or private, and in the sense of taking advantage of one's position to further private ends. There is probably a broader meaning. The grafter is not only he who prostitutes his official position, but his allies and fellow-conspirators who share with him in the gains illegally drawn from the public."

"These are they who hang around city halls, around the lobbies of our parliament buildings. Not that they love their city and nation so well that they burn with a desire to render service."

"No. They are there to help 'mill' contracts. They are hangers-on, go-betweens, who by adroit hypocrisy befog honest men and officials, prey upon incompetent ones and share up with dishonest ones."

"Nor is the grafting always at the expense of a government or municipality. Recent investigation in New York has revealed how officers of great corporations have enriched themselves by dishonest means. Profits of secret transactions with corporation money went to these grafters. Men in receipt of colossal salaries augmented these by commissions, which had they been honorable men, they would have scorned to receive."

DUTIES OF DIRECTORS.

"A species of dishonorable dealing for which I have no technical name is that which attaches itself to the relation of director and shareholder. How much is done by law to safeguard the interests of shareholders I do not know but

everything possible should be done. All the publicity possible without injury to business should be compulsory. There should be inspection by public accountants.

"Being a trust relationship, directorship should naturally develop a high sense of honor, and a director should never be guilty of anything in the least repugnant to the most delicate and sensitive conscience. Yet in several ways this relationship may be and frequently is violated. One of these ways is the using of inside knowledge to personal advantage and the disadvantage of shareholders."

"Any practice whereby the directors and other insiders continuously possess information to the exclusion of the smaller shareholders, is calculated to rebound to the great advantage of the one class and to the disadvantage of the other. Seized in advance of coming increases in dividends and other changes in policy, the insiders enjoy an unjustified advantage point in the purchase and sale of the securities concerned. For example, the directors of a leading Canadian corporation recently met and decided to raise their dividend rate, but agreed, as is commonly the practice, that the increase was not to be announced to the shareholders for some days. Immediately after the decision was come to a sharp advance in the company's stock occurred, and two directors are alleged to have taken advantage of their secret information to forthwith load up with the security in question before the shareholders should have an opportunity to do so. If this charge is true the men in question were guilty of a distinct and flagrant breach of the trust placed in them by the great body of shareholders."
