Halifax Extends Warm Welcome To Viscount Alexander And Family

HALIFAX, April 10 - (CP) - Viscount Alexander came to Canadian soil today to take up his commission as the King's representative and immediately hastened toward Ottawa to take the oath of the Governor-General.

There was little of the reserved Britisher about the famous Field Marshal as he cast down the gangplank of the transport Aquitania. As he doffed his hat to acknowledge the cheers of Halifaxians crowded in the pier, he inadvertently held it upside down to catch the sprinkling rain.

After when he stood on the observation platform of his special train to pose for photographers, he was greeted by a cheering throng. "I like your weather," he murmured to the hundreds who braved the unseasonable cold rain to see their Governor-General and his family.

Poland Levels Charges At Franco's Regime

Says Germans Being Sheltered While Devising New Means Of Warfare.

By FRANCIS W. CARPENTER NEW YORK, April 10 - (AP) - Poland today accused the Franco Government of Spain, before the United Nations Security Council of endangering world peace, sheltering Nazis and aiding German scientists in devising new means of warfare.

It asked the Council to crack down on the regime which, it said, was giving the United Nations.

The Polish charges against Franco were announced by the United Nations Secretary General as the Council, in executive session, decided to meet again Monday at 3 P.M.

At that time the Council will be confronted once more with the Russian-Iranian case. Russia is demanding that it be dropped from the Council agenda. Iran is insisting it should be held pending until May 6 to see whether Red Army troops completely evacuate Iran.

The consensus of U. N. observers was that Russia would be voted down and the case would remain before the Council.

Dr. Oscar Lange, Polish delegate, in his letter to the secretary general, Trygve Lie, dated April 9 and made public today, made these charges against Franco and his regime:

1. The United Nations Assembly in London considered the "Franco regime" as having been founded with Axis support. Developments since then have shown that the Franco Government has "already caused international friction and endangered international peace and security."

2. Franco's Government on Feb. 26, 1946, was compelled to close the frontiers between France and Spain and the border still is closed.

3. On Feb. 27, the Franco Government ordered the concentration of troops at the border of France.

4. Franco has given refuge to "the largest aggregation of Nazi assets and personnel."

5. Franco has given refuge to a large number of war criminals and Nazi leaders who continue to act from Spanish territory.

6. Franco "allows and promotes scientific research by German scientists engaged in devising new means of warfare."

A member of the Polish delegation said he could not guarantee that the attention of Government authorities, 30,000 pounds of rope arrived for those fishermen with prospects of more to come.
