ENTHUSIASTIC S.S. CONVENTION OF YORK DISTRICT

Held In York Church Recently --Reports Of Committees, Stirring Addresses And Routine Work Occupied The Convention For Two Busy Sessions.

The Sunday-school Convention of York District S. S. Convention met in York on Nov 21st.

Rev. Geo. E. Ross of Ch'town conducted devotional exercises using as a subject the words, "We are all members, one of another." His words were deep, convincing, and encouraging.

After singing "Sound the Battle Cry" the President, W. Wheatley, took the chair and the business portion of the session was carried out.

Minutes of last convention were read and approved followed by the appointment of a nominating committee comprised of Rev. G. F. Dawson, James Essery and L. H. D. Foster.

Next in order came the roll call and eleven out of thirteen schools were reported. The reports were encouraging, and proved that in York District at least the Sunday-school feels that it is part of the Church of Christ.

After singing Rev. J. M. Rice read a paper on "The Teacher". He brought forth some grand truths, among them being three qualifications of a good S. S. Teacher, namely acquaintance with the truth, personality, feeling.

This paper was ably discussed by Rev. G. F. Dawson, Rev. G. E. Ross, Rev. John Hawley and others, and was exceedingly interesting.

Meeting closed by singing the Doxology. The evening session of the Convention met in the same place at 7.30. Rev. G. F. Dawson conducted devotional exercises after which minutes of first session were read and approved.

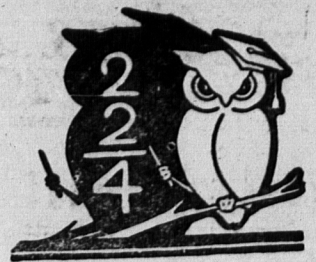
