CHAMBERLAIN LETS CAT OUT OF THE BAG. LONDON, Dec. 15.—Giving an outline at Glasgow of the Unionists' tariff proposals Austen Chamberlain said he would not tax raw materials. While they would make great changes regarding manufactured goods, they would not make them in a wildest revolutionary spirit. There would be a two-shilling duty on foreign wheat only.

1,000 BABIES AS "SUICIDE" REBUKE. PITTSBURG, Dec. 16.—In the presence of many worshippers, 1,000 babies, who were accompanied by their parents, were blessed at St. Paul's Cathedral, as a mighty protest against race suicide. The children ranged in age from a few weeks to three years.

The object of the ceremony was to bless the children and to create a greater interest in the parents for the care of the souls of the little ones. The prime object of the ceremony, as given out by the officiating priests, was to call the attention of parents to their solemn duty of bringing children into the world and rearing them in the right way.

It is an expression of the glory of motherhood," said the Rev. Father Brown, "to see all these mothers here with their children. Christ said, 'Suffer little children to come unto me, for of such is the kingdom of heaven.' He did not say that to defeat the laws of nature would be tolerated. Race suicide is a sin and heinous crime and all parents should shun it as they would a pestilence.

Race suicide has already ruined one great country, and eventually will depopulate it, unless radical measures are taken to combat the greatest evil known in modern times. The crowning glory of woman should be to bear children, as Christ intended should be their position.

MARCONI SYSTEM SECOND BEST. LONDON, Dec. 16.—The relative merits of the Marconi and Poulsen systems of wireless telegraphy were discussed before the House of Commons select committee to-day. J. E. Taylor, the Post Office's wireless engineer, after explaining that he had retained only a few shares of Canadian Marconis when he realized the probability of a contract being made between the English company and the Post Office, testified that if he were free to adopt one system or the other in view of his experience with the Poulsen system in America he certainly would be inclined to accept it, as the continuous wave system is bound to come.

Replying to William Redmond he said he did not communicate his views about the Poulsen system to the Post Office because he was not asked to do so, but at any rate his views were well known in the department.

Commander Loring, the Admiralty's wireless expert, said he did not believe the Poulsen system could use sufficient power for long distance communication, and he held that the giving of the contract to the Marconi company was the proper thing to do.

PEACE CONFERENCE. LONDON, Dec. 17.—The peace delegates have the power not only to arrange peace but to sign a treaty. This was made clear at today's session. When they adjourned for lunch the Turks went to their hotel, and the allies remained in St. James Palace yesterday. All dined together.

MILL HAND ATTACKS BOSS WITH KNIFE. WARREN, Dec. 15.—Angered at the discharge of his wife from the Scales & Jenks woolen mills and his wrath aggravated by the refusal of mill officials to give him his pay so he could leave the company's employ also, Mike Mazur, about 35 years old, is alleged to have attacked John S. Clancey, boss finisher in the mills, with a pocket knife and to have stabbed him three times. A fourth jab at Clancey was stopped by a pocket book in the hip pocket of his trousers and the knife blade was put out of commission. Mazur was arrested in his home by Deputy sheriff Walter A. Putnam who will have him before the district court in East Brimfield to-morrow morning. Deputy sheriff Putnam also claims to have found the knife that figured in the cutting under Mazur's bed. Clancey was cut in the forehead, the left side of the neck, and the left shoulder. According to the story of the affair told Deputy sheriff Putnam, Mazur was discharged early this morning and her husband immediately announced his intention of leaving and demanded his money at once. His demands not being met promptly enough to satisfy him it is claimed he followed Mr. Clancey into the yard and attacked him.
