Says Auxiliary Ferry Boats Found To Be Unsafe Island transportation problems are discussed by Hon. J. Ralston, Minister of National Defence and M. P. for Prince, in a recent letter to the West Prince Liberal Association. Col. Ralston acknowledges receipt of resolutions passed at the annual meeting of the Association and says in part: "With regard to the letter: There is very little I can add to the letter which was published in the paper some time ago, except to say that since then we have learned of two or three boats which might be available as an auxiliary on the run. These were in New York and on each occasion I have arranged that the Department of Transport send a qualified engineer down to inspect them. I am very sorry to have to say that they have advised that apart from any other consideration, the boats would be unsafe. At the present time the third one is under consideration but the final report is not yet available as to whether or not it would be suitable.

Island Soldier Describes Visit To Vatican City L-Cpl. Macdonald of Mt. Stewart who is serving with the Eighth Army in Italy, has returned home on his visit to Rome and Vatican City. He says: "It was a couple of days in Rome. It is sure a grand city. As you know, it has never been bombed and it has some wonderful buildings. I visited St. Peter's Cathedral, the largest church in the world. I waited for over an hour to get a glimpse of the Pope. There was a terrible crowd of Canadians and Yanks there to see him. When he did come, he was carried in a big gold chair by half a dozen of his guards. When he came to me he put out his hand and I kissed his ring and then he gave me his blessing. I sure felt proud. You may see it in the News Reel. I am enclosing a picture of the present Pope which I got when I entered St. Peter's. He looks exactly like his picture, very small and old looking but as spry as can be. I also visited the Colosseum where many of the Saints are buried and saw seven or eight tombs which contained the remains of different Popes who died hundreds of years ago. I am going back in the front lines again and I have been transferred to a large car and I am now in charge of five of a crew. That is sure some responsibility for in action you have five lives to think about beside your own. Love to all. Your soldier son, COLIN
