SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

October 4.

CHRIST ANNOINTED FOR BURIAL LESSON. Mark xiv. 1-11. GOLDEN TEXT. Mark xiv. 8. "She hath done what she could: she hath anointed My body aforehand for the burying."

THE NARRATIVE.

The story of the anointing of Jesus by Mary is chronologically out of order in the records of Matthew and Mark, but they both place it in order to show how things came to pass in each case we have the declaration that immediately followed the Olivet prophecies. He said to His disciples, "In two days the Passover," when He would be delivered. Now at that very time the rulers were scheming for His arrest in intrigue with Judas. John, in his Gospel, tells us that this feast was six days before, and that it was in connection with this that Judas had left the company, and gone to the high priests.

We are here, then, in a strange and electric atmosphere. Everything was converging toward the Cross. For its accomplishment grace was planning, and sin was plotting. Now we may confine ourselves to this wonderful story. The coming of Mary in this way on this occasion was most significant. From the confession of Peter, certainly some months before until now, the Lord had constantly re-affirmed. His statement then made for the first time, that He must go to Jerusalem, and die, and be raised again. This teaching had amazed His disciples, had filled them with fear. It is idle for us to criticize them, for their attitude was a perfectly natural one. This sense of amazement and fear so obsessed them that they seem almost entirely to have lacked anything like sympathy with their Lord. Now here as the darkest hour was approaching there flamed out one touch of real appreciative sympathy. With keen, womanly intuition, Mary seems to have realized that He was going to death and to have realized it, apart from what it meant to them, or to their hopes and aspirations. She

would seem to have realized it from His standpoint, more nearly than any of them. How was it possible to tell Him? How could she communicate with Him, and reveal to Him the fact of her appreciation, and the going out of her heart toward Him in sympathy? Words in such hours are always unsatisfactory, and almost useless. Ordinary actions are not sufficient. It was an hour demanding the extraordinary; and she yielded herself to it, lavishly pouring upon Him the wealth and fragrance of the sacred nard.

The story is made yet more beautiful by the recollection of our Lord's words concerning the occasion. True it is that they were called forth by the criticism of apostles who did not understand, but we are none the less thankful for them. He realized the true meaning of the action, and named it, as He said, "She hath done what she could; she hath anointed My body aforehand for the burying." Let it be observed also that He receiveth the action for Himself, but He also received it for the world, as He said that what she had done should be told for a memorial of her whatever the Gospel should be preached. This was not merely a reward for Mary. It was the taking of her action, and making it the inspiration of like attitudes and activities through all the coming age.

The tender story ends with the terrible account of Judas. He had no sympathy with Jesus. He complained, and, being rebuked, left the company and went out on his dark work of betrayal.

THE TEACHING.

Here, again, under very different circumstances, as to the immediate happening, our Lord is seen in all His glory. Here He is revealed as compelling the deepest things in human lives to find their expression. In the case of Mary it was that of her devotion. In the case of Judas it was that of his treachery. Here He is seen, moreover, perpetuating the good, as accepting the adoring anointing of Mary. He immortalized it, and thus made it, as we have seen, not a revelation of what was in her heart merely, but the inspiration of similar love and service throughout all the coming years.
By His revelation of what lay in the heart of Judas, He was compelling

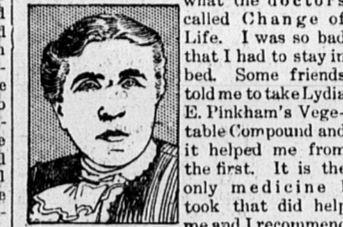
ing the had to move out into that definite hostility to Himself which must issue in its own self-destruction.
