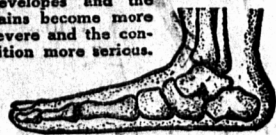

WILL BE A GOOD THING FOR HALIFAX.

MONTREAL, Nov. 2.—Sir Thomas Shaughnessy, speaking of the minister of railways' announcement at Halifax, stated that the promised improvements would certainly be a good thing for that city. Sir Thomas stated that the shipping people had always recognized the fact that such facilities were necessary to the development of the port of Halifax and such being the case, the railway facilities would also be improved.

Speaking of the Nova Scotia section of the C. P. R. the president declared that work was going on all along the Dominion Atlantic system. When the Canadian Pacific had secured that road they found the large bridges in a very bad condition and they were now being rebuilt and this would, no doubt, be followed by re-tracking the road with heavier rails and bringing the whole line up to the C. P. R. standard.

After that, it is said, he accumulated a wife and two children at Kortright, N. Y.; a wife and one child at Norwich, N. Y.; a wife at Deposit, N. Y.; a wife at Baltimore, a sixth wife, and two children at Frederick, Md.; two wives and one child at Philadelphia; three affinites and two children also at Philadelphia; a wife and two children at Easton, Pa., and a wife at Bangor, Me. One of his Philadelphia affinites abandoned her husband for Ellsworth who, it is alleged, forged the husband's name to a \$1,500 cheque. Such were the allegations of the police, who added that they would fill the court room with Ellsworth's wives, children and affinites when he is brought to trial.

FELL FORTY FEET TO DEATH.

ST. JOHN, Nov. 3.—Falling forty feet through a hatchway in the Opera House, Bernard Cribb, aged 23, an employee of the Standard newspaper, was fatally injured soon after midnight on Saturday and died tonight in the Public Hospital.

The young man was leaving the building and groping his way in the darkness fell headlong through the hatch, and falling into H. N. Demille & Co's. store, severely fractured his skull. Mr. Demille was in the store, and heard the crash and found the man unconscious. He was immediately rushed to the Hospital.

Cribb is a native of Chatham. This is the second fatality that has occurred through the same hatch. Dr. George Hetherington being killed there a few years ago. An inquest will probably be held. Cribb was a well known ball player and runner.
