ALLIES AND GREECE SIGN AGREEMENT.

PARIS, Sept. 2.—The Athens correspondent of the Havas Agency says that a final agreement has been signed by the Entente Powers and Greece concerning navigation and commerce. Greece agrees to take the strictest measures for the suppression of trade in contraband articles and the Entente Nations consent to the free exportations of tobacco and raisins on the basis of export statistics previous to the war and the importation to the British colonies of all goods exclusively reserved for individual consumption in Greece.
