CULLINAN DIAMOND WILL BE CUT IN TWO

One Half to Adorn the British Crown and the Other His Majesty's Sceptre.

LONDON, Sept. 10.—The "Cullinan," the greatest diamond in the world, which was presented by the Transvaal Government to the King, has been cut into two beautiful white stones, one of which will be set in the royal crown, and the other in His Majesty's sceptre. Details of the cutting were given by Sir Henry De Villiers, who arrived at Plymouth from Quebec, where he was the South African representative.

Having heard recently of the progress of the diamond cutters in Holland, he explained that the two chief gems resulting will ornament the sceptre and the crown of King Edward. When it was shipped to England it was a question what the quality of the diamond would be, experts being unable to tell the perfection of a stone from the rough. Now it has been found to be of superlative quality, pure white, and possessed of remarkable brilliance and lustre. The cutting will employ three artisans for one month. One of the diamonds will weigh 425 carats and the other will be slightly smaller, but both will be immeasurably larger than the Koh-i-Noor (102 carats). The great cost of cutting will probably be met by the value of the chips which come from the perfect gems.

SETS FIRE TO POWDER HOUSE FOR NOTORIETY

Man Who Received Many Medals For Bravery For Another One.

PARIS, Sept. 11.—A man named Proudhon has been arrested in Toulon for setting fire to a powder magazine in the arsenal. His character is a particularly good one, and he has received a large number of medals and awards for saving life from fire and water. It is believed that the fact of receiving so many medals has turned his head and caused him to become incendiary. For six months Proudhon longed to add another medal

to his collection, and on Saturday being unable to contain himself any longer, he set fire to the powder magazine. He displayed the utmost bravery in helping to extinguish the flames from which he rescued a sentry and another man, a fact which afforded him no little satisfaction. The fire might have been terribly disastrous, however, for the magazine was one of the largest in Toulon.

JUDGE MACKENZIE FOR NORTH RIDING

Convention Votes 68 to 12 For the Former Member and Finally Made it Unanimous.

NORTH SYDNEY, Sept. 11.—The Liberal convention held at Baddeck today for the purpose of nominating a candidate in North Cape Breton and Victoria for the approaching election, was a most complete success. Every polling district in Victoria and North Cape Breton was represented. Eighty delegates answered to the call. Hon. J. N. Armstrong, President of the Liberal Association, took the chair, with A. J. McDonald as Secretary. The only names before the convention were Judge D. D. McKenzie, of North Sydney, and A. C. Ross, M. P., and upon the vote being taken, sixty-eight voted for McKenzie and twelve for Ross. The nomination was then made unanimous by a standing vote in favor of Judge McKenzie. The meeting was harmonious and unanimous throughout, and closed with cheers for Sir Wilfred Laurier, Judge McKenzie and A. C. Ross. The following delegation was appointed to wait on Judge McKenzie to tender him the nomination: Warden Buchanan, Baddeck; D. C. McDonald, Sydney Mines; Councillor John C. McNeil, Grand Narrows; Hon. J. N. Armstrong, North Sydney.

ACCIDENT AT TORONTO FAIR

Wire Breaks and Woman Falls Forty Feet to the Ground.

TORONTO, Sept. 11.—Marie LeBlanche, who gives a thrilling specialty at the exhibition grand stand performance, is in the General Hospital with three ribs broken, concussion of the brain, and other injuries, as a result of an accident Monday afternoon. Suspended by the neck by means of a pulley arrangement, she glided along a steel wire, starting at a height of 150 feet and dashes into a netting placed about ten feet above the ground. While in the middle of the act Monday afternoon and at a point where she was forty feet above the ground the steel wire broke near the end and she fell in a heap on the hard ground. Her injuries were attended to by doctors on the ground, and later she was removed to the hospital.

COLLISION NEAR HUMPHREYS MILLS

Express Crashed Into a Ballast Train, and Young Girl Was Injured.

MONCTON, Sept. 10.—Considerable damage was done by a collision between No. 2 express and the ballast train at Humphreys Mills this morning.

Fifteen year old May McGee had a narrow escape. The Express crashed into the van of the ballast train piling that car into the dump against a telegraph pole. The car was badly smashed but all the occupants except the McGee girl had jumped before the collision took place. It was not until ten minutes later that the trainmen heard cries coming from the mass of wreckage and found the girl in the remains of the car. She was somewhat bruised but not seriously hurt. The passengers on the express were somewhat shaken up and both locomotives were badly damaged.

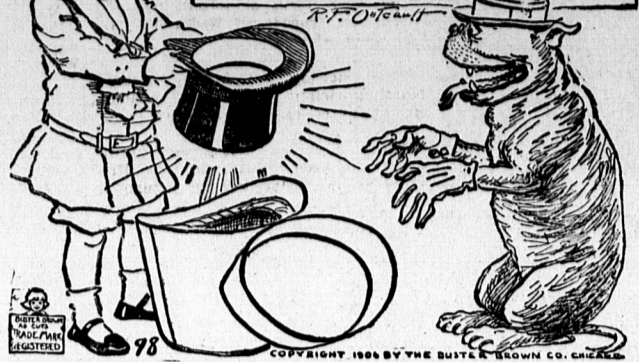

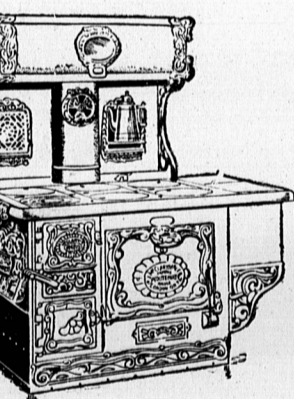

EXHIBITION RACES.

There will be two class races held in connection with the King's County Exhibition, on Wednesday, September 30th, 1908. The classes are as follows:—

2.40 Class, Trot and Pace, Purse \$100.00.
2.50 Class, Trot and Pace, Purse \$0.00.

These classes are open to horses owned in King's County for one month previous to the date of the exhibition. Entries close at 8 p.m. Wednesday, September 29th. Records made at Charlottetown races no bar. All races end at the conclusion of the fifth heat. —one must in every case accompany entry. Entrance fee 5 per cent of purse, and 5 per cent additional from winners. Purse divided, 50 per cent, 25 per cent, 15 per cent and 10 per cent. Five horses to enter and three to start. Hopples not barred. National Rules to govern, except when they conflict with the above conditions. Communications must be addressed to the Secretary.

Excursion return tickets will be issued by regular trains from all stations to Georgetown at One Way First Class Fare on September 29th and 30th, good to return up to and on October 1st, 1908. Tickets at Special Reduced Rates will be issued from Souris, Mount Stewart and intermediate stations to Georgetown on September 30th, good to return on the same day. Return tickets from Souris, Mount Stewart and other stations at proportionate rates.

Passengers from Charlottetown, Scotchfort and intermediate stations may obtain tickets at the reduced rates, and go by regular morning trains on same day, or following morning. Tickets are good only for continuous journey in either direction. Returning special train will leave Georgetown for Souris at 6.30 p.m.
