CANADIANS IN FINE FORM AT BISLEY

BISLEY CAMP, July 14.-The famous Bisley rifle meeting opened this morning. There is a gratifying increase in the entries in a majority of the competitions as compared with the starting day last year.

This year's entry for the King's Prize totals 1,038, which is a drop of five as against last year at this time but nine days still remain to account for the sixty-five entries necessary to bring the figure to equal the final entry for 1912.

In the St. Georges Challenge Vase, there are 1,014 entries, as against 961 last year, while the Prince of Wales series shows 807, compared with 275 and the Alexander series 661 against 734.

The Canadian men are all in fine form and looking forward to doing well in the various competitions in which they are engaged.

BIG HOTEL FOR MONTREAL

LONDON, July 14.-As announced a few days ago, the St. George hospital site has been purchased for a large new London hotel. It was learned yesterday that the enterprise will be financed entirely by English capital, and those interested have just closed a deal for the purchase of the site of St. Georges Church in Montreal, where a new modern and exclusive hotel will be erected. It is said that the Montreal hotel will contain about 600 rooms, and it is supposed that the London hotel will be about the same size.

BIG SALE OF FOXES.

EDMONTON, Alta., July 14.-One of the biggest sales of live foxes ever effected, has just been completed by Jack Lessard, brother of P. E. Lessard, M.P.P. Mr. Lessard has been at Wabiscow, 150 miles from Athabasca Landing, collecting foxes. With the assistance of Indians and half-breed trappers he succeeded in acquiring 48 red, blacks and silvers. The foxes have all now either been sold or bargained for to the representatives of Prince Edward Island breeders in Edmonton. The aggregate price realized was \$23,000.

TWO SUFFRAGETTES AGAIN IN TOILS

LONDON, July 14.-Mrs. Emmeline Pankhurst, leader of the suffragettes, and Miss Annie Kennedy, one of the most ardent militants, are again in the hands of the authorities.

Against an order of the court they appeared at a meeting of the Women's Social and Political Union where Mrs. Pankhurst announced she would die rather than submit to government. The police undertook to arrest both women. Mrs. Pankhurst fled from the building and escaped in a taxicab. She was pursued by a detective but succeeded in getting away.

The arrest of Miss Kennedy precipitated a fight in which well dressed men and women engaged in hand to hand fighting with the police. Umbrellas and sticks were freely used. The police succeeded in forcing Miss Kennedy into an automobile and drove her to Holloway Jail. Several other arrests were made. Mrs. Pankhurst had received an ovation at the meeting. She leaned heavily on a table as she addressed a few fervent sentences to the audience. She said "I am a rebel as Sir Edward Carson is," both of us rebels because there is no other way open to us to redress our grievances. I would sooner be a rebel than a slave. I would rather die than submit. I mean to be a voter in the land of my birth or die. My challenge to the Government is give me freedom or kill me."

PERSIAN LAMB, ASTRAKHAN KRIMMER AND BROADTAIL

Persian Lamb is the name given to the fur produced by a broad-tailed sheep of Asia. It is called Persian Lamb when it is tight curled and lustrous. When the curls of the lamb are more open, usually caused by an intermixture of fine woolled blood, it is called Astrakhan. When the open curls have a greyish appearance it is called Krimmer. The Broadtail fur is the name given to the skins taken from unborn lambs-the mother having died for some reason.

In a recently published German book "Die Karakul Schafe" the author Herr Hohenheim states that the conclusions in breeding Persian Lamb in the various lands and climates may be briefly condensed as follows:

- 1. That there is not demonstrable any influence of either climate or soil of the steppes of Bokhara and Chiwa, on the quality and amount of curl of the skin of the Karakul lamb.
2. That a deteriorating influence of European climate and feed on pure European bred Karakuls is not observable.
3. That the characteristic "curl" and "penciling" of the fur is a mendelian character, which had originated probably by mutation.
4. That this character was probably strengthened by selection and is capable of still further improvement by the same method.

It seems as if the German farmer was preparing in his systematic and irrepensible way to add a valuable industry to his agriculture. It is chagrining to say the least, that America exports annually millions of dollars worth of fine furs and skins, but ALL AS RAW MATERIAL. London and Leipzig are the centres of the world's fur trade and our best and costliest skins go there and are re-imported after being made valuable by skilled artisans, who receive apprenticeship and industrial training in the excellent European schools.

It would be an advantage, in order to diversify fur-farming in Prince Edward Island, that the production of Persian Lamb and Astrakhan be taken up here. The difficulty will be to obtain stock of good quality. It is hoped that Dr. Young, who lectures on the subject on Monday next at Charlottetown will be able to instruct us on how to procure and produce these sheep. He is the greatest living authority on the subject. 329-MII.

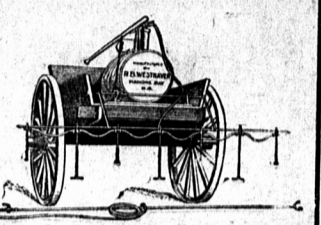
BALKAN STRUGGLE WILL SOON END

LONDON, July 14.-In the house of commons to-night, Sir Edward Grey, the British foreign secretary, replying to a suggestion that an armistice should be forced on the Balkan states, said that it was impossible to exaggerate the horror of the war, but mere words were not likely to affect the situation, and it would be most difficult for the concert of Europe to resort to force to impose peace. Bulgaria had asked Russia to aid her in securing peace, and Serbia and Greece had agreed to cease hostilities upon certain conditions. As to Turkey, no exception could be taken to her action, so long as she adhered to the Enos-Midia line.

The essential thing for the powers, said the foreign secretary, was to perfect and maintain an agreement. The war was so exhaustive that it would not be of long duration, and no complications ought to arise endangering the European concert. There was every reason to believe, he concluded, that matters would be brought to a satisfactory termination.
