Scotland's Greatest Tenor Coming.—Mr. Geo. Neil the great Scottish tenor who appears here next month in conjunction with four of Scotland's finest artists is a personage of great importance in his own country, and although he has appeared with wonderful credit to himself in all the important centres of Europe this will be his first trip across the water. Neil has had the honor of appearing before Royalty on many occasions and the songs of Scotland have been popularized by none more than by this foremost tenor, not even excepting the inimitable Jessie MacLachlan, with whom Mr. Neil is appearing constantly in the old country, in those same popular Scottish duets, which he will sing here with a splendid soprano, Flora McIvor Craig.
