**CURRENCIES**

NEW YORK, Nov. 28—(CP)—The Canadian dollar and other leading foreign currencies closed slightly lower on the foreign exchange market today.  
 The Dominion currency finished 1-16 cent lower at a discount of 13 1/2 per cent in relation to the United States dollar. (Ottawa Foreign Exchange Control Board rate 9.09-9.11 per cent discount.)  
 The free pound sterling was unchanged at \$4.04 while the Hong Kong and Shanghai dollars declined slightly. The former losing .01 cent to 23.66 cents and the latter .05 cent to 6.2 cents. The free Argentine peso fell .09 of a cent to 23.51 cents.

**Grain**

WINNIPEG, Nov. 28—(CP)—Aided by a little local support and higher prices at Chicago, wheat futures showed minor gains today on the Winnipeg grain exchange. At the close values were 1-8 cent higher with December at 72 5-8, May 76 7-8 and July 78 1-2 cents.  
 No export trade was reported, but there was a suggestion from New York of a small amount of durum wheat for United Kingdom shipment. This could not be confirmed locally. Buenos Aires remained unchanged with prices holding at the fixed level.  
 All grades of cash wheat were in demand here, but light offerings restricted business, and spreads generally held unchanged.  
 In the carcase market there was general buying of calfs and barrels, with trade in furs and live was limited due to restricted offerings.

**The Feeding And Care Of Colts**

(Experimental Farm News)  
 The selection of good breeding stock is of importance to successful breeding, but the proper care and feeding of colts is equally necessary, says C. F. Bailey, Superintendent, Dominion Experimental Farm, Fredericton, N. B. Colts that are underfed and improperly cared for as yearlings are underfed and poorly developed when they reach maturity. On the other hand, overfeeding involves unnecessary expense and may create a tendency for animals to become unsound.  
 At the Fredericton Experimental Station roomy box stalls are provided for colts. Two colts of the same age run together where space will permit. The colts are fed off the floor - this practice tends to strengthen the knees and develop the leg and neck muscles of growing colts.  
 Colts are fed a daily ration composed of good, clean, mixed hay and crushed or rolled oats and bran (4 parts to 1 of bran). The amount of grain fed per day varies with the size and condition of the colt, but as a general rule, not more than one pound of grain is fed for each 100 pounds live weight. Turnips are fed each day, but carrots are preferred if available. Iodized salt is before the colts at all times and water is supplied at regular intervals throughout the day.

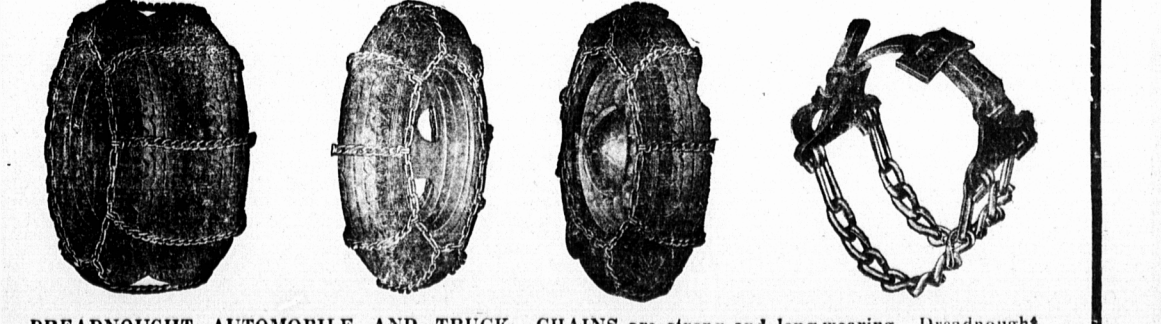
