Follow Nude Parade of Doukhobors

NELSON, E. C., Sept. 4.—Nelson's two jails, provincial and city, are crowded tonight and the police are attempting to cope with an overflow of nude and partially clothed Doukhobors members of the Sons of Freedom sect, who were rounded up this afternoon by six provincial and as many specially sworn-in police officials, following a nude parade on the provincial highway near South Slovan, 13 miles from Nelson.

Police first invaded the Doukhobor camp at South Slovan with the intention of arresting four members who were reported to have doctored early this morning. On appearance of the officers, more than 75 per cent of the Doukhobors in camp—about 115 men and women—removed their clothes and chanted as they marched down the road.

Automobiles, trucks and buses were rushed to the scene and the men, women and children were herded in to them and taken to Nelson. Many were still nude upon arrival here and some even refused to don clothing when placed in jail.

Peter Verigin, leader of the Christian Community of Universal Brotherhood, who had ordered the group from the Doukhobor colonies, was present today and was reported to have done all in his power to keep the encampment in order after police arrived.

(Canadian Press) YARMOUTH, N. S.
