During the next fifteen minutes local fans were on their toes and silent as McEwen bailed rubber away from the danger area. Several times the Abegweits nets escaped by only a miracle.

The Wolverine offensive ended as suddenly as it had begun. Taking a pass from a mix-up behind the Wolverine nets Squarebriggs started a left wing shot into the desired quarter to score the final tally of the evening.

For the remainder of the period the Abegweits parade was broken up by heavy checking. Gillis soloed for the Wolves taking a hard wing shot at McEwen.

The last half of the stanza was extremely rough and presented to the spectator a scene of slashing sticks, tumbling players and hard checking by both teams.

Continuing their relentless assault the locals scored their second tally two minutes later when Squarebriggs grabbed an outskated puck from behind Saunders, carried it to the Halifax blue line and released it at the twines. Five minutes before the end of the frame Lawlor carried the puck up the left wing and scored on a long, bullet-like shot which McDonald bounded out to meet, but missed.
