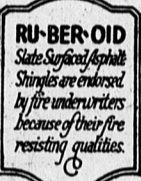

TO ATTEND CELEBRATION.—Wycliffe College, originated fifty years ago in Toronto which will hold its Jubilee Celebration, Sept. 21 to 27th, has had a wonderful career and is today recognized as one of the most important Theological Colleges of the Church of England in Canada. Its equipment is of modern and high standard, together with affiliation with the University of Toronto. Since the commencement of her work, the College has equipped for the work of the Sacred Ministry 397 men; these are now in the following fields:—Canada 263; Mission Fields 24; England and U. S. A. 58; Retired or Dead 52. The Theological teaching given in Wycliffe College is based upon the principles of the Church of England as defined at the Reformation and set forth in the Book of Common Prayer and the Thirty nine Articles. Among the speakers at the Jubilee Celebration will be His Grace the Archbishop of Rupert's Land, Primate of all Canada; Right Rev. Bishop Taylor Smith, Late Chaplain General of the British Forces; Many Bishops of the Canadian Church; Sir Robert Falconer, President of the University of Toronto and many others. As many as possible of the graduates will be present including Rev. R. H. Holmes, of Alberton, Rev. C. F. Johnson of Milton, Rev. H. D. Raymond of Charlottetown, and Rev. G. T. Spriggs of Kensington.
