COLONEL MacLEOD FLATLY REFUSED TO RECOGNIZE DOYLE

(Canadian Press) SAINT JOHN, N. B., May 14. — Will this cancellation readmit us into the Union. Wire at once your acceptance or refusal of my offer. He replies please consult MacLeod about action suggested in your wire, wire your sentiments." (Sgd) "Sam Doyle."

Following is the statement issued by Colonel MacLeod:—"The reinstatements made by Doyle were cancelled by McVicar and athletes were warned not to compete with or against included in Doyle's reinstatements. Doyle has no authority to act in any capacity, either as to reinstatements or cancellations in respect to amateur athletes in the Maritime Provinces. The cards have been cancelled whether Doyle is willing or not. Only Doyle's unconditional resignation, as promised when soliciting support at the Amherst meeting and to myself the morning following, will influence the Maritime situation as related to him, he can submit his unconditional resignation and turn over the records of the late branch and future consideration will then be given as to the readmission of the M. P. B."

Sammy Doyle Backs Down in Amateur Stand

CHARLOTTETOWN, May 14.—A conciliatory move was made yesterday by President Sammy Doyle, of the Maritime Provinces branch of the Amateur Athletic union of Canada, now under suspension because of the wholesale reinstatements last winter of amateurs previously suspended on suspension of professionalism, in the form of a telegram which he sent to the president of the parent union, J. A. McVicar, Winnipeg, offering to cancel all reinstatements. The

president replied advising President Doyle to communicate his decision to Colonel Norman P. MacLeod, Saint John, who has been given the task of re-organizing the Maritime branch.

President Doyle's message to McVicar and the latter's reply were as follows:

Doyle to McVicar—"Have learned from legal authority that branch had not the power to reinstate suspended athletes. Am willing to cancel such cards issued this winter at once. Will such cancellation of cards readmit us to Union? Wire at once acceptance or rejection."

McVicar to Doyle—"Please communicate to MacLeod at Saint John the action suggested in your wire."

It is understood that President Doyle has laid the correspondence before Col. MacLeod in accordance with President McVicar's message.
