Gallant Released On Habeas Corpus

An order for the release of John (Holman) Gallant from Prince County Jail was issued yesterday by Supreme Court Judge A. E. Arsenault.

The order is the result of an application of habeas corpus made before Mr. Justice Arsenault by J. O. C. Campbell acting for Gallant and argued in the Judge's chambers, Charlottetown, on Dec. 17 with Sylvère DesRoches appearing for the Crown.

Gallant had been tried before Magistrate E.H. Strong in Summerside last fall on a charge of having intoxicated spirits illegally in his possession. Upon his acquittal by Magistrate Strong, the Crown appealed the decision to the Supreme Court and on Dec. 2 Chief Justice Thane A. Campbell reversed the Magistrate's decision and imposed upon Gallant a sentence of \$500 and six months in jail or in default of payment an additional six months.

The main grounds taken by Gallant's counsel in his application for habeas corpus was that the commitment upon which Gallant was being held in jail was defective on several counts. Mr. Justice Arsenault concurred with the submission made by the appellant.

Progressive Firm Making Big Changes

The progressive firm of Sinclair and Stewart Ltd., Summerside, are in the process of making a number of important changes in their store and one of the first to be completed is the installation of a passenger elevator.

This elevator, manufactured by the Otis-Fenson Elevator Co. Ltd., of Hamilton, Ont. is the most up-to-date in Eastern Canada and has an automatic levelling device. This elevator will serve four floors starting from the lower floor where people can enter from the parking lot newly laid out to the rear of the store, and connecting with the main floor, office floor and the upper floor.

While of service to everybody, this elevator will be of particular usefulness to customers who find it difficult to walk up stairs. With the installation of the elevator, the main stairways were removed and the floors filled in on each level providing fifteen hundred additional feet of floor space. A new stairway shaft has been constructed of fireproof steel and concrete which climbs directly from the basement to the pent house on the roof housing the elevator machinery.—S.

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New Medical Discovery Announced

A new medical discovery, a drug that temporarily blocks off certain main human nerves and relieves pain and more serious troubles, was reported to the American College of Surgeons today by eight University of Michigan physicians.

The drug, tetra ethyl ammonium, has been known for years but never used on humans until about a year ago when the Michigan group took it up.

This drug does, temporarily, the same thing as the surgeon's knife when used to cut the sympathetic or automatic nervous system, in the operation known as paravertebral block.

That operation is used to reduce high blood pressure. The ammonium drops high pressure almost to normal in a few minutes, but is no use for that purpose because the drop is temporary.

But it does other things such as increasing the flow of blood in legs and arms. In seven minutes it has increased such blood flow in man by 2,000 per cent.

This made the drug immediately useful for many diseases that interfere with the blood flow in extremities. At Michigan, it has been used on more than 500 persons

suffering from Burger's disease, arteriosclerosis obliterans, Raynaud's phenomenon, functional vasospasm and thrombophlebitis, all painful and usually affecting the legs.

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Circulation Of Daily Papers Up

TORONTO, Dec. 19 — (CP) — Combined circulation of Canadian daily newspapers now is more than 3,000,000 copies daily, the Canadian Daily Newspaper Association reported today.

Since 1939, but today's figures exceed that year's by nearly 1,000,000.

The gains have been made despite a 50-per cent increase in newspaper prices during the last two years, and a 20-per cent jump in labor costs which forced many dailies to increase their price to the public.
