

Stock Market Prices On Downgrade Yesterday

NEW YORK, Nov. 17—(AP)—Late recovery checked an all-day retreat in the stock market today. Losses of fractions to a point or more were well in the majority at the final bell but the widest decline of the session was trimming in numerous cases. It was the market's first average setback after a 3-day advance. Many stocks took a zig-zag course, starting out higher, moving downward, and then rallying. Volume dropped below 1,000,000 shares for the first full session this month. The total of 970,000 shares compared with 1,060,000 Tuesday and was the smallest since Oct. 29. The Associated Press average of 60 stocks declined 2 of one point to 64.6. The rail group showed the widest loss while industrials and utilities did comparatively well.

At Montreal MONTREAL, Nov. 17—(CP)—Losses by selected industrials outnumbered gains about 3 to 1 on the Montreal Stock Exchange and Curb Market today. However, all of these losses were fractional as no issue dropped as much as a point. Trading was light and only seven issues had turnovers exceeding 1,000 shares each. Mines remained exceptionally active and closed on a decided downward trend. Industrial sales were approximately the same yesterday with a turnover of 42,300 shares. Mines totalled 326,700 shares, an increase of 93,400 shares over the previous day. Closing averages had banks up .03 at 27.52; utilities off .1 at 74.7; industrials off .6 at 130.9; papers off .301 at 345.35 and golds off 1.03 at 60.44.

At Toronto TORONTO, Nov. 17—(CP)—Golds continued downhill on the Toronto Stock Exchange to touch the lowest figure on the exchange's index since 1943 for the fifth successive day. Base metals followed close behind the golds, weakening on an almost solid list of losses. Industrials weakened slightly and western oils dipped after a firm opening. Losses outnumbered gains five

to one in the gold list as 10 issues recd at low. Dome was down 1-4 in the seniors at a new low at 14 and Hollinger, Kerr Addison, Bralorne and Wright-Hargreaves also weakened. Wright-Hargreaves dipped 12 cents to \$2.08 following announcement of a dividend cut. Aunor, Campbell, Central Patricia, Chesterville, Giant Yellowknife, East Maricote and Madson were down 5 to 15 cents in juniors.
