Yankees Widen Lead Over Cleveland To Seven Games

 CLEVELAND, July 17—(AP)—The fast-stepping New York Yankees virtually knocked Cleveland out of the American League race tonight with their second consecutive victory over the Indians, 4-3 in a tight battle before 67,468. Victory put the New Yorkers seven games ahead.
 Joe DiMaggio's hitting streak was snapped at 58 straight games as Al Smith and Jim Bagby retired him three times and walked him a fourth.

Lefty Gomez stopped the Indians with four hits and one run for eight innings, but the slim south-paw was routed by the Red king in a ninth-inning rally. Freeman Johnson pitched a triple to Larry Rosenthal, batting for Ray Mack, to allow two runs but bore down to retire pinch-hitters Clarence Campbell and Hal Trosky and Roy Weatherly to end the game.

Kay Gordon Wins Title For Third Straight Year

VERDUN, Que., July 17—(CP)—Kay Gordon of Winnipeg won the Dominion senior women's 100-yard free style swimming title for the third year in a row tonight when she swept to a close victory over Bernice Belbeck of Hamilton in the Canadian swimming and diving championships here.

Miss Gordon covered the Verdun Natatorium course in one minute and seven seconds, five seconds over the record, to defeat Miss Belbeck by half an arm-length. Ethel Gilbert of Winnipeg placed third.

DiMaggio's Hitting string Snapped at 56

CLEVELAND, O., July 17—(AP)—Joe DiMaggio's 58-game hitting streak was snapped here tonight as his New York Yankees beat Cleveland 4-3. The slugger's string began May 15 against Chicago and bettered George Sisler's modern record of 41, established in 1922, and Willie Keeler's 1897 mark of 44.

Going to bat in the eighth inning with his team leading 4-3 and the bases filled, DiMaggio hit into a double play to end the rally. In three previous appearances he grounded twice to third baseman Ken Keltner and walked once.

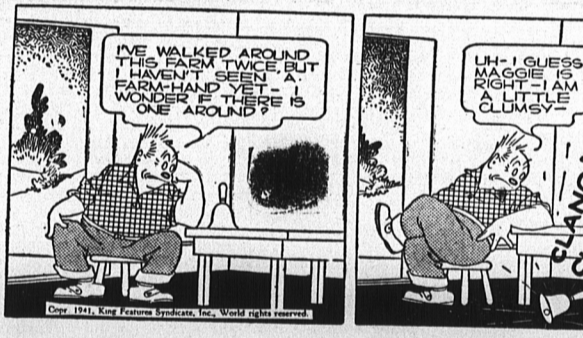
After qualifying for a semi-final heat last night, Jaeger placed third in the heat tonight, behind Gordie Castel of Montreal and L. Larson of Hamilton.

Favorite defeated in Golf quarter finals

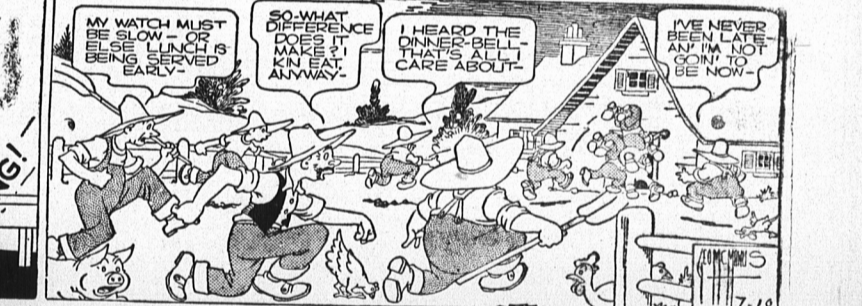
