

MEETING AT MARSHFIELD

A meeting was held in Marshfield Hall on Saturday, March 24th, for the purpose of considering the advisability of organizing a Boys' and Girls' Club in that district.—Prof. W. J. Reid of the Local Department of Agriculture and H. W. Clay of the Dominion Live Stock Branch, were present and outlined the objectives of the Club. It was decided to immediately obtain the required number of members from among the boys and girls of the districts of Marshfield, York, Dunstonsfane and Royalty. The number of members required is between 20 and 25. All members must be between the ages of 10 to 19 years on Sept. 1st, 1923. Each member must feed a pair of bacon pigs and show them at a Pig Club Fair, which will be held in September. The prizes are \$18, 2nd, \$17, 3rd and 4th, \$16 down to \$1. A number of such clubs were held throughout the island during 1922 and in every case they will be repeated in the same districts this year.

Mr. and Mrs. G. H. Holbrook left yesterday on a six weeks visit to Toronto.


Mr. George Pauling, who has been spending holidays at Wood Islands, expects to return to the city shortly. His many friends will be glad to welcome him.


