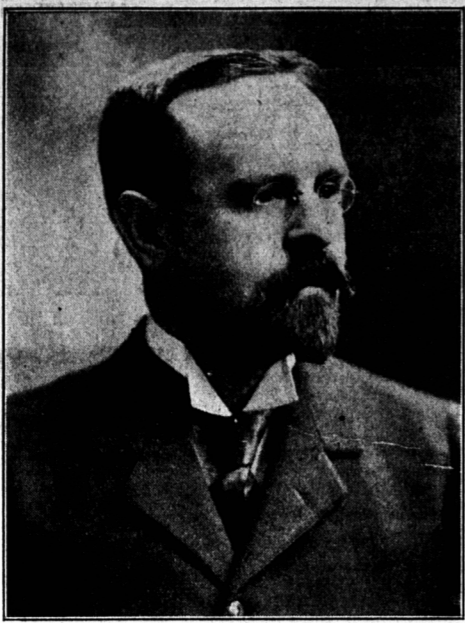

entire establishment which affords almost double the accommodation of the old one and gives correspondingly greater opportunities for exhibiting the large and varied range of goods.

On the first floor which is surrounded by a gallery affording extra floor space equal to one half the ground floor is shown furniture for parlor, bedroom, dining room and hall in all classes of goods from the most expensive to the more moderate priced grades. At the rear is an annex for parlor furnishings and pictures, known as the Picture Gallery. It is large, well lighted and tastefully arranged.

On the second floor is the carpet de-

partment which embraces carpets in Axminsters, Velvets, Wiltons, Brussels, Tapestries, Hemsps and Jutes, besides oilcloths, linoleums, matting, carpet squares, in all kinds and all descriptions to suit the purse and taste of everyone.

Here, too, are shown portieres, lace curtains, blinds and every kind of window trimming and fixing, blankets, comforts, mattresses, wadded mattress covers, silence cloths, table covers, etc. On this flat also are all kinds of furniture coverings for upholstering in tapestries, velvets, plushes, velours and cretons, together with corals, gimps, and trimmings of all kinds. In one portion is the picture framing department in charge of an experienced framer.

The third storey also extends over the adjoining building occupied by Hazard & Moore and includes the entire third flat of the building, the remainder of which is

occupied by them. This storey is used for surplus stock in case goods and parlor furniture, while in the annex of the adjacent building are shown office desks and chairs, heavy dining room furniture, couches, and other heavy goods.

The fourth and top floor contains surplus stocks in the lighter goods such as reed goods, children's sleds, kitchen tables, blinds and rollers, curtain poles, picture and wall moulding in endless variety, and tier upon tier of top mattresses of all goods including Marshall Sanitary and Ostermoor, wire mattresses in different makes including the celebrated Copper King and Hercules.

The three storey warehouse and repair shop recently erected to the rear of the shop is completely filled. The main buildings is stocked with iron beds, wooden beds, lounge frames, and parlor frames for upholstering purposes and selected lumber in mahogany, walnut, oak, basswood, white wood, and other varieties used in the repair shop and make-to-order department.

The second floor is devoted to chairs of

the cheaper grades while the third floor is used for workshop and repair department which was formerly on King Square. This room is connected with the office by private phone and is under the personal supervision of the Proprietors.

AN INDEPENDENT'S VIEW.

SIR:—I always have been a supporter of the Liberal Government but I am growing independent on account of the way the Government has lavished money upon its members. No doubt Canada has grown large in wealth and in population and therefore our representatives have more work to do and it takes longer to do it but the indemnity of \$2,500 is well worth the time spent in this work. The \$2,500 indemnity, had as it is, is not the chief stumbling-block of the Government. It is this grotesque thing of pensioning the ex-Cabinet Ministers. This is appalling in a civilized country where men are free to vote for any Government. What will our representatives say when they call again on the electors for their support in the next three years? Will they say that they opposed this Act? If they do will the electors believe them? Undoubtedly not, because all members of the Government supported this bill and they themselves are aspirants for a seat in the Cabinet at some future day. And when they grow rich and tired they can retire and receive a pension of \$3,500 for life. The Government ought to abolish this act because any man who receives an office as Cabinet Minister ought to have made his mark and be well able to live in his latter days without getting a pension. Or what did the Government pension the ex-Cabinet Ministers for? What reason had they for doing this? We never heard and I suppose we never will. The Government should repeal this Act and cut down that indemnity of \$2,500 to \$1,200 and decrease the pay of the train men and decrease the freights and fares of our train service and give people a chance of shipping and travelling by train. And then, do away with the Senate chamber, for this is only a dead branch, although it hangs on. The Government can well do without it. It's only a home for old fogies who became short winded and could not speechify and the Government gave them a cushioned seat to rest their weary bones. Sorry that such a good Government which gave us everything it promised should trip over such stumbling blocks as these, but I hope it will retrieve itself and regain its feet for if not worse may happen. And now is the time to make it right. Don't wait for three years to do it. Do it now.
