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**DUTIES OF THE KING'S \$10,000 A YEAR COOK.**

LONDON, April 7.—Mr. Menager, the King's ten thousand-a-year cook, does not live in Buckingham Palace, but has his private residence close to it. On arriving at the palace, usually about 11 o'clock in the morning, his first care is to inspect the lunch menu for that day, which has been prepared by his first assistant, and also the menu for the breakfast the following morning. He then prepares the dinner menu for the following day, a task that occupies him usually a couple of hours. No two dinners at the Royal table are ever the same. Certain dishes are from time to time repeated, frequently by special request of the King, but what may be termed the general scheme of each dinner is always different.

One of the side kitchens is reserved solely for Mr. Menager's use, where he carries on experimental culinary operations and is constantly elaborating and working out new ideas. Some dishes have taken him months of preparation before he has decided to put them in to the menu. There is one particular sauce which Mr. Menager invented some years ago for which the King has a particular liking. Mr. Menager was making experiments for more than three years before he served this sauce to the Royal table.
