## THE NEW COUNCIL

### Summerside City Fathers in Session.

Appointments of Officers—The New Town Clerk—Arrangements With the Banks—Lumber, Nails and Spikes—Purchase of Stone for Streets—A Scott Act Prosecutor.

SUMMERSIDE, March 13. — (Special)—The first regular meeting of the new Town Council was held this evening, the Chairman and all the Councillors present. After reading of minutes and passing a number of bills, applications were read from Messrs John Mollison, C. B. McNeill, Thomas Robertson and H. J. Massey for the position of Town Clerk.

It was moved by Councillor Wood, seconded by Councillor Sobey, that H. J. Massey be appointed Town Clerk and Wharfinger at the usual salary. Motion carried.

Several applications were read for the positions of appraisers. Allan McKinnon and A. L. Anderson were appointed at salary of \$25.

The following officers were also appointed for the ensuing year:—Clement Arseault, Harry Williams, Fence Viewers; Dr. McLellan, Health officer.

On motion of Councillor McLeod seconded by Councillor Wood, Mr. Fred Peters was appointed Scott Act Prosecutor and policeman.

On motion of Councillor Sobey seconded by Councillor Muttart, John C. McDonald was appointed policeman and assistant Wharfinger at a salary of \$32 per month.

The following appointments were also made: Durcan Palmer, Joseph Richards Pound keepers; Edward Fraser, engineer of fire engine Beaver; Thomas Frizzell chief of Fire Department at salary of \$35 per year. John A. McDonald, fireman for steam engine Beaver at the usual salary; Albert Gaudet, street man at \$26 per month.

In reference to the appointment of fire wardens, Councillor Sobey suggested that the by-laws provided that this duty should be performed by the police and the matter was ordered to be left in their hands for the present. The tender of Mr. Archibald McDonald for hauling the fire engine Beaver for \$45 for the year, being the lowest, was accepted.

The following committees were appointed: Street Committee, Councillors Allen, Muttart and Sobey; Purchasing Committee, Messrs. McLeod, Dickieson and the Chairman.

Councillor Sobey thought that spikes and nails should be purchased wholesale and a supply kept in charge of the Clerk to be delivered to the street man as required.

Coun. Muttart moved, seconded by Coun. McLeod that the Town Clerk be authorized to correspond with mill-owners in New Brunswick, with a view to ascertaining the prices at which lumber for street purposes could be procured. Carried.

Coun. McLeod moved that the chairman be authorized to make the usual arrangements with the Merchants Bank of Halifax or any other bank for any overdrafts that may be required.

Coun. Muttart moved, seconded by Coun. McLeod that a quantity of hard stone be purchased at once in lots to suit for street purposes.

Coun. Muttart gave notice that at the next regular meeting he would introduce a motion to amend the by-laws relating to the collection of taxes.

Coun. Sobey moved, seconded by Coun. Wood, that Joseph D. Perry be employed to supply water for the fire engine while at work at a salary of \$18 for the year. Carried.

Coun. Dickieson stated that the fire bell at the east end of the town is broken, and should be replaced. The Chairman promised to see to the matter.

A committee from Rev D. J. G. McLellan was read, drawing the attention of the Council to the recent gasoline explosion in Compton's Factory on Central Street, and dwelling at considerable length on the possible danger of allowing gasoline to be used in that building, situated as it is on a populous street and near the Convent. He asked that the Council take the matter into consideration. The Chairman and Councillor Sobey were appointed a committee to investigate this matter and report at next meeting.

A note for \$87 in favor of the town, dishonored at one of the banks, and a disputed note for \$102 were ordered to be handed by the Clerk to an attorney for collection. Council adjourned.
