WEDNESDAY.

—BOARD OF TRADE.—Owing to a small attendance of the council of the Summerside Board of Trade, the meeting to be held last evening was postponed until a later date.—J.

—SHIPMENT OF SHEEP.—The first shipment of lambs from the Island this season, 441 in number, was made by Mr. S. H. Jones yesterday morning. The shipment goes to Boston.—J.

—THE EMPRESS.—The outward cargo of the Empress yesterday morning consisted of about 1,100 bags of oats, 1,000 bags of starch, 440 lambs and two cases of mixed freight.—J.

—THE SWANSEA TRADER.—The Swansea Trader from Halifax arrived in Summerside at 6 p. m. on Monday, and after loading about 2,000 bags of oats and potatoes, was ready to sail on return about daylight, but owing to the rough weather was still in port last evening.—J.

—SUMMERSIDE NOMINATED.—Among those in nomination on the Progressive ticket in the State election of Massachusetts, which takes place next month, is Mr. Weldon L. Crossman, a former Summerside boy, who has resided in Boston for some years. He is nominated representative of the 9th Suffolk District for the State House of Representatives.

—THE MORWENNA.—The Morwenna, of the Black Diamond Line, from Montreal, with the largest inward cargo of the season, arrived in Summerside at noon Monday and left again about 3 a. m. Tuesday for St. John's, Nfld. Her outward cargo consisted of 600 bags potatoes, 500 bags of oats, one car of straw, 100 cheese, 50 head of cattle and 46 sheep.—J.
