**Papers Erratic On Montreal Market**  
MONTREAL, Oct. 16 (CP)—Papers were erratic following their upswing as a reaction to the in- crease in the price of newspaper, industrial and golds were higher on the whole and utilities were weaker on balance in transfers to- day on the stock exchange and curb market.  
Winners in papers were Fraser, Great Lakes, Abitibi Preferred, Powell, Bathurst and International. Price and Donnochs finished ahead after being both up and down. Consolidated and M. & O. converted rises into losses and Brown was down and St. Lawrence "A" up for a time in arrears were B. C. Forest, Abitibi Common, St. Lawrence Common and Paper Pre- ferred, Donohue, H. Smith and MacLaren.  
In a stronger industrial group were Canadian Industries, Ford, Cement, Canadian Car "A", Found- eries, Hamilton Bridge, United and Eastern Steels, Massey Harney, Vic- tors Steels, Moore Maroon, Can- adian Locomotive, Consumers Glass, Davis "A", Cockshutt and Foundation. Losers were Algoma, which opened firmer, R. Mitchell, Celanese and Dominion Textile pushed up in their section and Webeco lagged. Canadian and Na- tional Breweries posted increases in beverages, Seagrams switched from win to loss terrain and Melcher and Alco "B" were also off.  
C.N. Power, S.C. Power, Win- nipeg Electric, Brazilian and B.C. Power "B" were harder in utilities. Bell ceded a gain and among softer issues were Ottawa Power, which dipped 2 3/4, Quebec Power, Mon- treal Power, Galt, Eau Common and Preferred and Jamaica. Toronto moved up in banks following an- nouncement of its "extra" divid- end. In other banks, Montreal was better and Commerce eased.  
Declining in their section start, Provincial Transport and Steam- ship Common slipped in carriers and Steamship Preferred improved.  
In pivotal metals, H. B. Nickel- mining, Smelters and Nickel advanced, Noranda failed to hold an increase and Alcoa Preferred backed up. Imperial was up and Petroleum down in oil refineries.  
In golds, Hollinger, Pato and Bva- lomo chalked up rises. In higher ground in junior mines were Buf- fadison, East Sullivan, Goma, Je- rusalem, Ontario Nickel and In- ling back were Pitt, Elder and Cen- tral Cadillac.

NEW YORK, Oct. 16 (AP)—Last-minute selling greased the way for a declining stock market today. Final prices were down fractions to around 3 points and more although a number of stocks retained all or part of early gains.  
The Associated Press 50-stock average was down 5 of a point at 64.2 after Tuesday's mark-up of 2.4 points.  
Canadian stocks were mixed within a narrow range. In liquors Hiram Walker advanced one point and Distillers Seagram Canadian Pacific 1-4, Lake Shore, 1-4. In the mining column were U.S. Steel down 1-2 at 146 1-2, 300 La Luz, 3-4 at 98, Santa Fe 7-8 at 88 1-8, Westinghouse 1-8 at 26 1-8, Eastman 7 at 213, Armour
