### TO AID FISHERIES

OTTAWA, June 7—The department of marine and fisheries is not slackening its efforts to keep the inland waters of Canada stocked with fish and arrangements have been practically completed for the building of a whitefish hatchery in the Georgian Bay, in the vicinity of Collingwood. A most suitable location is being investigated by experts, and in a very short time the hatchery will be ready. An up-to-date floating shed

hatchery, modernly equipped, has just been placed in the St. John river. Its convenience lies in its being able to be transferred from one place to another for the placing of young fish. It is stated that representations are continually being made from different parts of the country protesting against the depletion of fish. These protests are carefully regarded by the department which is at present giving careful attention to the inland waters and the preservation of the fish.

### THREE CHILDREN DIE WHILE FATHER AWAIT'S TRIAL

BUDAPEST, June 7—A painful and dramatic scene occurred in the criminal court here at the trial of a cash-mer named Emil Bruck, who was arrested at the instance of his employers, Messrs. Schwarz & Co., for having misappropriated about \$750. While he was awaiting trial his three young children all died of

measles within twenty-four hours, and at the opening of the case the prosecutor, Herr Schwarz, informed the judge that, out of consideration for this, the firm had decided to withdraw the charge, and asked for the acquittal of the prisoner. Bruck, who had not been informed of what had happened at home while he was in prison, was so overcome that he swooned in the dock. As soon as he regained consciousness the court ordered his immediate release.

### BALL OF 100 YEARS AGO.

LONDON, June 7—The Royal Albert Hall was the scene, last night and early this morning, of the greatest function of the season, the "Ball of a Hundred Years Ago." All the notable figures of English Society were present and the splendor of the setting never had been

surpassed in any spectacle in London. The ball was under the special patronage of the king and queen, and members of all the most famous families in England appeared in the guise of their ancestors of a century ago.

A series of brilliant quadrilles represented the court, society, the government, and navy and army clubs in 1842, the year made memorable by Napoleon's Russian campaign, the

peninsular war, and the war between Russia and Turkey.

The Duchess of Richmond's famous dance before the battle of Waterloo was danced again. The Countess of March appeared as the Duchess of Richmond in a dress which was a reproduction of that worn by the Duchess of Richmond at the famous ball. For this quadrille Sir Charles Hartopp represented Napoleon, and Lord Harding was Wellington.
