## Morning Stock Letter

NEW YORK, Oct. 8.—The London market is quiet today partly due to the rather firm Russian note showing lack of neutrality in the Spanish situation. The Bank of France has reduced its rate to 2-1-2 percent. Chesapeake and Ohio directors intend to declare a \$1 extra dividend and also a \$2 dividend in new preference stock, subsequent to the approval by stockholders. Dividends meetings scheduled for today are Calif. Packing and Columbia Gas. The action of Chesapeake and Ohio directors will probably help the rails today, furthermore the action of the utilities in the last hour yesterday would indicate improvement in these shares today. In view of the five day successive advance regularly may be expected in this section, but subject to irregularity still believe that the market will do better.

NORTHERN MINER ITEMS  
 MONTREAL, Oct. 8.—Little Long Lac—Important new ore results on the eighth level in the two bottom levels 875 and 1000 feet each show ore length of 400 feet. Production rate is to be gradually stepped.

MONETA.—Six diamond drill-holes indicate an ore body with length of 300 feet, with 11 feet and average grade of \$15.

HARD ROCK Crosscutting from shaft on 150 foot level intersects vein averaging \$18.70 across 14.5 feet.

PAYMASTER.—Over 400 foot of new ore in No. 2 vein opened up on the 600 foot level. A new vein discovered at surface lying 600 feet north of No. 3 vein.

Car loadings during the last two weeks September gained 7 percent over corresponding period last year. Western Canada Flour Mills operating profit before depreciation for fiscal year ending July 31 was \$177,861 against deficit of \$1,378 for preceding year.

WINNIPEG, Oct. 8.—(CP) Price boosts in wheat were the rule on Winnipeg Grain Exchange today as a flood of bullish trade news prompted brisk buying of futures.

Net gains of 1 3/8-1 8/8 cents were registered, October closing at \$1.09 1/8, November \$1.09 3/4, December \$1.07 7/8 and May \$1.09 1/8 1/8.

To the accompaniment of a revival in export sales of wheat, price advances in outside markets, marketing difficulties in Argentina and a strike settlement in Minneapolis, values were strong throughout the active session.

All grades of cash wheat were in demand, partially due to the improved labor situation in Minneapolis. Coarse grain prices moved higher with wheat.

TORONTO, Oct. 8.—(CP) The gold group of the Toronto mining market closed today at the lowest level touched since May 28 last. A few of the big golds recovered part of Wednesday's setback but with few exceptions, the secondary golds lost ground.

Base Metals were only mildly heavy.

Bralorne stood out in the higher-bracketed golds, gaining 20 to a new high at \$9. Dome and McIntyre advanced 1-2 point each and Wright Hargeaves added 5.

Hollinger, Pioneer, Teck Huifus, O'Brien, Buffalo-Ankerite and Pickle Crow sold down narrowly.

Losses of 5 to 10 were banded for mining corporation Pampour, Red Lake Shore, Siscoe, McWatters, Argosy, Darkwater, Macassa and McLeod-Cockshut. Soft spots in the Penny group were Central Porcupine, Greene Stabell, Gunnar May-Spiers, Powell-Rouyn, Roche, and Central Manitoba.
