Hitler Shoots Works, Gambles Rule Over Europe Against Starvation

U. S. A. peace too is threatened by the Nazi invasion of Holland. Hitler gambles starvation by and Belgium. If it succeeds it is a blockade against rule over Europe—alone in a world largely hostile.

Will it succeed? The Nazis could win a minimum objective by overrunning northern Holland where the Dutch can fight little but delaying action, and British help can arrive only by narrow seas. In such seas German air power has just recently stymied British sea power. Air power may well enable the German army to win this minimum objective in Holland, whereupon German planes and submarines can intensify the danger to already endangered Britain. But that will hardly win the war this summer. To do that Hit-

ler must strike the main Franco-British armies a shattering blow and now the best opening is through the "low countries." Holland and Belgium are flat, far more free of natural barriers than the French frontier. The Kaiser took this northern route in 1914. He spared the Dutch, but completely surprised the weak Belgian army, blew up its forts with new heavy artillery.

BOTH BELGIUM AND HOLLAND READY

Today Hitler tackles Dutch and

Belgians both. Although both are fully warned, strongly fortified and have — Belgium especially—good armies totalling a potential 1,500,000. They are weakest in the air with perhaps a thousand planes of different types combined. Germany has a superiority in the air over the allies in the west of 3 to 2 or even greater. It is superiority enough to hamper British efforts to land troops by sea in northern Holland, even although here the good Dutch navy were able to help. That, more than conquest of northern Holland, is the maximum

German objective. The Nazis are driving a spearhead between Holland and Belgium and with the Meas river as protection sweep out westward, flank the Maginot line intending to try and beat the Allies in the field. This movement the Nazi air force is aiding by landing troops to seize the Dutch canals, flooding stations, and the Belgium railroad junctions through which would come allied reinforcements from France. **BRITISH NOT FITTED FOR ALL FRONTS** Some British units are seasoned

regulars. More are newer formations better fitted for holding quiet French sectors than for such open warfare as we shall now see, lightning-like in its rapidity, fearful in its demand on troops and especially on officers. But the French are another story. There is the best conscript army in Europe in organization, homogeneity, staff work and peace time training. The Nazis surpass it in equipment and in fighting experience. That experience was gained against under-equipped Poland and unaware Norway. Now Germany

strikes the real thing. Her hope is not in her army alone but in her air power that largely won those trial heats. On both she bases a prodigious gamble. If she seems to be winning, she probably counts on Mussolini joining in attacking France. The bombing of Lyons and of Switzerland may be preparations or diversions. France may be squeezed in the pincers north and south or France and Britain may counter-attack through the Balkans. Then, who knows what Russia will do and Japan? Armageddon has begun.

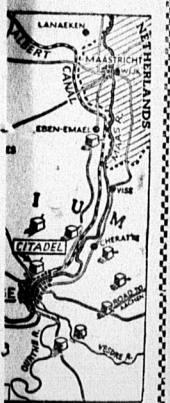
